

FLO INDIVIDUAL PROJECT

NOTES FOR THE FACILITATOR

SUITABILITY:

The Individual Project is suitable for use with students in Years 6 – 9 who have sound literacy skills. It can also be used with older students who are not yet ready to attempt SACE or Certificate-level work.

WORKBOOK AND REPORT DOCUMENTS:

This Individual Project has been developed by an ICAN Flexible Learning Project Officer and may be used by all FLO Case Managers and Program Providers.

To obtain a copy for your organisation, please contact your local Flexible Learning Project Officer (this will allow the Project Officer to identify this learning resource as being used by your organisation in your region).

The Flexible Learning Project Officer will request that you provide templates for:

- Certificate of Participation (considered appropriate for students who attempt the Individual Project and complete some, but few, aspects of the workbook)
- Certificate of Achievement (considered appropriate for students who complete the Individual Project and complete all or most aspects of the workbook)

NB: IT IS CRUCIAL THAT THE WORKBOOK AND REPORT ARE NOT ALTERED IN ANY WAY.
(The SACSAs outcomes are directly linked to the workbook as it stands).

STUDENT'S WORK:

An example of the brainstorming page is included for the facilitator's reference to support the beginning stages of the project.

Please retain all student notes, print-outs and drafts and attach to the workbook.

Help the student to draft, proofread and edit their work before they complete the good copy in the workbook.

SACSA-ALIGNED REPORT:

- Students must complete the tasks specified under each SACSA outcome in order to achieve the outcome
- Ensure that the FLO Coordinator sees the workbook and completes the relevant sections of the report
- Ensure that a copy of the final completed report and certificate is filed in the student's Case Management for Learning Portfolio (CLP) or equivalent.

The SACSAs Overviews (Key Ideas and Outcomes) are supplied as a reference only so that the facilitator is aware of the aspects and outcomes identified in relevant subject areas.
