Lupe claims that *'you can take la chola out of el barrio, pero you can't take el barrio out of la chola.'*

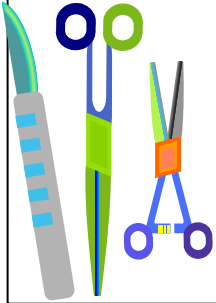

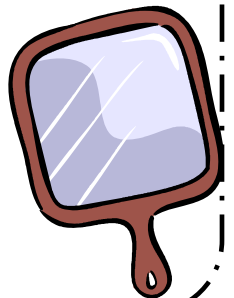

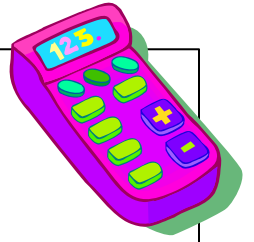
