



# Google Classroom for LOTE

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## GETTING READY

In order to avoid any issues later, it is strongly recommended to follow the procedures below. If you can, set up a practice "Classroom" with a colleague before trying this on a student assignment.

### Classroom

### Doctopus

### Goobric



Make sure all students are members of the Google Classroom



Download Doctopus Google Chrome add-on



Go to Drive and make a Folder. Call it Goobrics.



Students can download the app to be notified when grades are posted.



Google it if it does not come up in your add-ons



In Google Sheets, make a rubric. Box A1 must be blank. Name the Project Goobric. Ex: Tech Essay Goobric.



Post as "Assignment" so students have a place to turn in work.



Once it is on your computer, we will come back to it later.



Make a separate Sheet for the grades to appear. Name it for that year. Ex: 2018 Tech Projects. Leave this blank!



## \*IMPORTANT NOTE\*

In order to grade using doctopus/goobric, a student MUST "turn in" a Google Doc via Classroom. You cannot "send" a graded goobric without a doc turned in. Also, this does not work on Google Slides.

### STUDENTS TURN IN WORK

Must include a Doc in addition to anything else.

### OPEN ASSIGNMENT GRADE SHEET

This document is currently blank but will be filled with student grades and comments as you go along.

### GRADE PROJECT

Grade all facets of the project on the Goobric on the Doc. Don't grade on the Goobric of Slides, they won't be able to see that when finished.

Examples: students can turn in:

- a Doc and a recording
- a Doc and a video (not a link to a video)
- a Doc and a Slide

Open the blank document and click Add-ons -> Doctopus -> Launch.

1. Select Mode: Ingest Classroom Assignment
2. Select Class (Spanish 4? French 3?)
3. Select Assignment (choose name)
4. Ingest Assignment
5. Attach Goobric

Click on the appropriate criteria for the Goobric. Type any comments and grade in the box provided. Doctopus will not automatically tally the score. When you click SUBMIT it will "paste" the scored rubric onto the student Doc under their work.

### PUT GRADE IN CLASSROOM

Go back to Classroom Assignment to enter grade

### ENTER IN SCHOOL GRADEBOOK

Remember to enter grades into school grading system or your paper gradebook.

### RUBRIC AVAILABLE FOR CONFS

This gives easy access to student work during parent conferences or student conversations

When finished scoring on Doctopus, go back to the Google Classroom assignment, enter grade and "Return" the graded assignment. Students with the GC app will be notified right away.

Share a short testimonial quote from teachers or peers on the student's performance based on the skill on the left.

Work and scoring rubric is stored here until you delete it. Note: if a student switches sections, work will not transfer to another Classroom.



## WHY MIGHT I WANT TO TRY USING GOOBRICS?



### Advantages

- Quick & easy (after initial set up)
- No huge stacks of papers
- Digital record of student work
- Students can turn in work via any mobile device
- Can enter "half" numbers if a student falls between 2 criteria



### Disadvantages

- Work must be in the correct format or it does not appear in Doctopus
- Not easy to highlight/circle mistakes
- Computer access issues if not a 1:1 school
- Students are able to unsubmit work in Classroom and it won't show up in Doctopus



### Caveats

- Show students how you are grading
- Teach students to upload in the correct format
- Demonstrate how to find rubric and comments.
