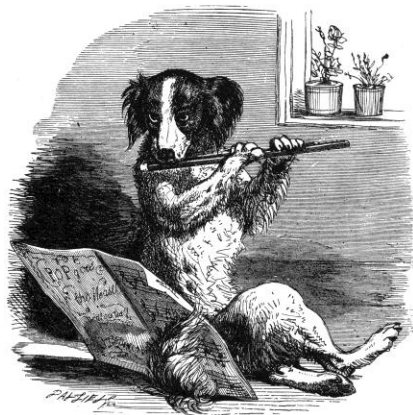


QUOTATIONS TIMELINE



STEP ONE:

Identify 20-30 major events/details revealed in the novel so far. These should be items you think are **IMPORTANT** and/or **REVELATORY** to the story. Focus mainly on plot elements (things that happened), but feel free to include character details or observations too.

STEP TWO:

Organize the events/details **CHRONOLOGICALLY**. Because your novels are contemporary fiction, you are likely to find time “fragmented” – plots that shift back and forth among the past, present, and future. Think about how these would appear on a timeline (past-----present-----future).

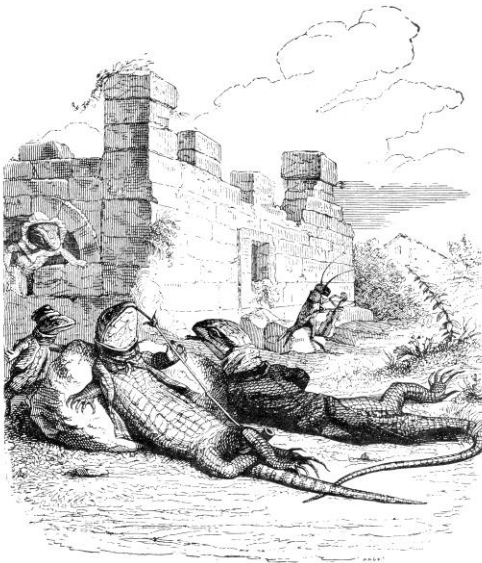
HINT: For several of these books, you may want to create more than one timeline, separate from each other, to fit the characteristics of your novel. For example, you may want to create separate timelines for what **REALLY** happens and what happens in **IMAGINATION**. Your novel may also work best if you create different timelines for different characters?



STEP THREE:

Search your novel for quotes that fit at least TEN of the items on your timeline. Write them here:

STEP FOUR:

Make the timeline(s)! Using the receipt paper, write out your events/details in chronological order, inserting the quotations in where they belong. Be sure every person takes a turn writing!

Please write the quotations in a different color from the timeline entries to set them apart.
