

Make 'n Take



Name of Make 'n Take: A Promise is a Promise Pipe

Theme & Topic: The Numbered Treaties in Saskatchewan – The Meaning of the Pipe in Treaty-making

Materials:

Light brown fun foam, black marker, yarn, feathers, brown pencil crayon

Procedure:

1. Trace pipe on brown (light) fun foam (40 cm long and 8 cm wide) and cut out.
2. With black marker write "A Promise is ... a promise" in dotted printed letters.
3. Draw with black marker, an opening for tobacco stack and mouth piece.
4. 20 cm from mouth piece put a rectangular piece of brown felt (For an authentic look add brown leather instead).
5. Wrap yarn around the end of 2 feathers together. Tie around the pipe beside the brown rectangle.
6. In the tobacco stack cut up brown felt pieces and yellow yarn and place in opening on stack (to look authentic use real tobacco) – moss like string stuff.

7. Shade opening to mouth piece with brown pencil crayon or pencil
8. At the end, each student presents their pipe to another student in the class and makes a promise to them to keep.
