

## Make 'n Take



Name of Make 'n Take: Personal Treaty Medal

Theme and Topic: Treaties-The Spirit and Intent of Treaties

**Materials:** 2 paper plates, felt, foam or construction paper, glue, sticky letters and numbers

### Procedure:

1. Discuss how the treaty medal was a symbol of the treaty. Discuss how students make classroom rules, goals for student learning. Compare these rules to making treaty. Then say that making rules and goals are like making a “treaty” with their teachers and parents.

2. Make a treaty medal.

**Side 1** – using felt, foam or construction paper make a teacher and a student. Glue onto 1 paper plate.

Using sticky numbers + letters, stick on the date and place (school) of the treaty signing.

**Side 2** – Using collage, make a symbol or picture representation of their own school goal.

Glue the two sides of the medal together and hang.

3. Adaptations – Students can cut out pictures from magazines instead of using collage or they can take digital photos of teacher and students to use on medal.
4. Our example shows:

**Side 1** – The teacher and the student shaking hands on the treaty. It also shows the date and place of the personal treaty.

**Side 2** – A symbol of the student's goal. This example shows the student wanting to practice 3 digit subtraction with borrowing.
