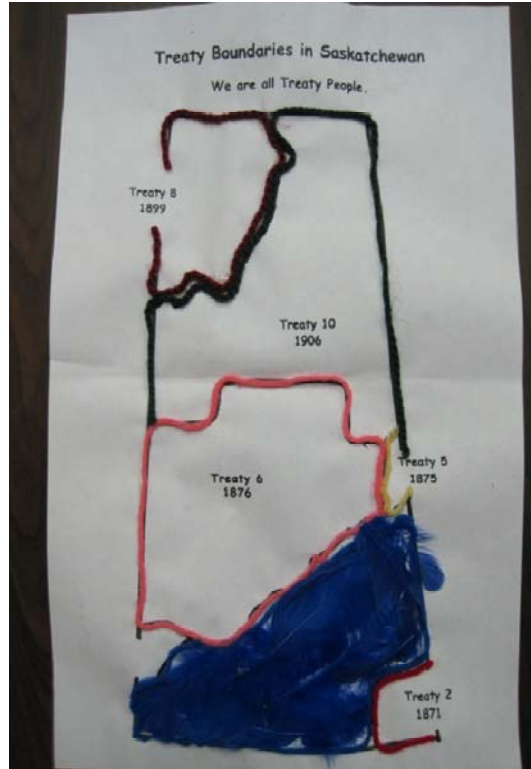


## Make 'n Take



**Name of Make 'n Take:** Treaty Boundaries in Saskatchewan Map

**Theme & Topic:** The Lifestyles of First Nations Peoples Before and After the Arrival of the Newcomers – We Are All Treaty People

**Materials:**

Yarn, (purple, green, pink, red, yellow), white glue.

**Procedure:**

1. Enlarge blank map of “Treaty Boundaries in SK” (11 x 17). Give students precut colors of yarn, (purple, green, pink, red, yellow), play dough, paint, feathers, paper, etc.
2. Students use white glue and outline each treaty boundary – doing 1 color at a time. Some boundaries are adjoined.
3. Treaty 4 – Let students use various materials to completely color/highlight that section. (Play dough, paint, feathers, paper, etc.). Be sure that the choice of medium is not too heavy to hang up.

Make enlarged treaty map for your bulletin board. Laminate then have each student sign their name in the Treaty 4 section. Bulletin Board Letters – We Are All Treaty People.
