

Make 'n Take



Name of Make 'n Take: Drum and Sacred Animals
Theme and Topic: Traditional Teachings – Mother Earth
Name of Teacher: Linda Parent

Grade: 2
Date: December 8, 2009

Materials:

Butcher Paper, paper plates, hole punch, markers, 5 coloured feathers for each student, glue gun, scissors, pencil crayons, suede lace or strings of wool (no needles needed)

Procedure:

1. Each student picks **one** sacred animal. Teacher previously explained the meaning of a “sacred animal”: wolf, caribou, moose, buffalo, raven, eagle, turtle, fish, frog, bee, mosquito, butterfly, etc...
2. Students cut the butcher paper to fit the paper plate upside down. On this round piece of butcher paper, they draw and colour their favourite sacred animal.
3. At once, they punch holes through the butcher paper and the paper plate. Then, they sew the edge with the lace using their fingers (no needles). Knot the lace, trying to hide the knot.
4. On the “south end” of the drum, glue down 5 feathers with the glue gun. Let dry.

*** The picture shows paper clips not the lace. Please use lace in place of the paper clips.
