

## **Make 'n Take**

**Name of Make 'n Take:**      **Animal Jackets and Coats**

**Theme & Topic:**                **First Nations and the Newcomers Settle in what is now know as  
Saskatchewan – First Nations Reserves and the Settlement of the Newcomers  
on the Land**

### **Materials:**

Brown butcher paper or large roll of tanned paper, paint brushes, paints, beads

### **Procedure:**

1. Students choose an animal that would have been found in Saskatchewan between 1850 – 1900 to design a jacket or coat.
2. Students trace and cut out a jacket from a pre-cut design. Use large roll of tanned paper.
3. Crumple paper to resemble leather.
4. Students paint jacket to represent the fur of the animal.
5. Brainstorm how paint may have been made to decorate beads. i.e. berries, leaves, blood, etc...
6. Students use paint brushes to dab designs onto jackets. Use beading as borders, etc... Don't get into symbols in this lesson.
7. Use jackets for student trading simulation activity.
