Materials:

Paint, white, red, blue and yellow ribbon, paper plate, construction paper, black pipe cleaners, string or yarn

Procedures:

1. Students work in partners. Using 2 different colors of paint, each student will place one painted hand print on each of the plates. The plate will have one hole punch.

2. Using four colored ribbons, white for north, red for west, blue for south, yellow for east (20 cm each) tie together through hole in top of plate. This will be for hanging the plate.
3. Print year at bottom of plate. Print “WE ARE TREATY PEOPLE FOREVER” on top.
4. Students will each make a ceremonial peace pipe out of construction paper. Using a pencil, role a small piece of construction paper and glue or tape to seal.
5. Coil half of black pipe cleaner around a pencil leaving about 1 cm stem to poke into end of pipe.
6. String 1 red, 1 yellow, 1 white and 1 blue bead onto approx 15 cm of ribbon. Tie around the peace pipe. Add feather using hot glue gun or whatever works.
7. Staple pipe across the palms of hands.
8. Adaptation: Children could paint or draw their concept of “forever” before a hand painting. i.e. “as long as the sun shines”
9. Adaptation: Use construction paper to trace hands. Glue down on plate, have fingers intertwined.
