CLOTHING
ACCESSORIES
JEWELRY



CLOTHING

- pants
- shorts
- t-shirts, blouses, dress shirts, sweaters, or sweatshirts
- skirts and dresses
- tank tops or layered tank tops



Make sure your clothes cover the 4 Bs: Backs, Breasts, Buttocks, and Bellies.
I know it sounds funny, but it's not.



CLOTHING

- Clothing with sayings, slogans, or political messages on them
- Clothing that appears to be worn out
- Clothing that exposes too much
- Undergarments worn as regular clothing
- Sweatpants and pajamas during program activities





SWIMWEAR

- Two-piece swimsuits, decent coverage only please
- One-piece swimsuits
- Swim trunks



SWIMWEAR

- If you have to ask if it's acceptable, it isn't—nothing risqué or showy.
- Many cultures have different standards, so please show as little skin as possible
- Wear a shirt or cover-up on the way to and from the beach or pool

FOOTWEAR

- Comfortable shoes for walking, including tennis shoes and sandals
- Flip flops (just make sure you wear them when appropriate)



- High heels and platforms
- Slippers





ACCESSORIES

- Purses, satchels, and backpacks
- Sunglasses

Best accessory of all? Your lanyard! You must wear it at all times.

ACCESSORIES

- Any accessory that could cause you or the other delegates harm (wallet chains, etc.)



HATS

- Clean and in good repair

WHEN TO WEAR:

- On city walking tours
- At the beach

HATS

- No inappropriate logos or graphics

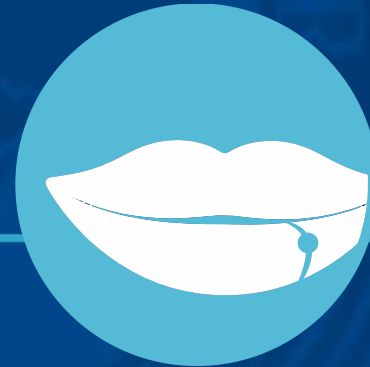
WHEN NOT TO WEAR:

- Bracelets, necklaces, and rings
- Up to three earrings are allowed in each ear
- Nose ring stud (up to approximately 3mm)



JEWELRY

- Gauged earrings and plugs
- Rings or studs in the lip, tongue, or eyebrows
- Any jewelry that could cause you or the other delegates harm (spikes, etc.)

UNIFORM

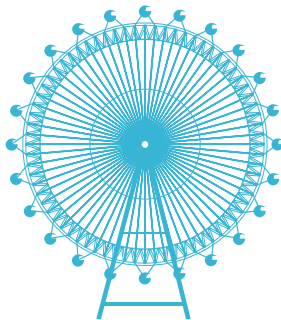
- People to People Ambassador Programs polo
