

# PHOTOSHOP - Ice Text

## Step 1

Create a document of the size you want, staying near to 600 pixels by 200 pixels, 300 dpi resolution (if you are going to print it) or 72 dpi if you're going to publish online. We can use 72 dpi to keep our document tidy and work faster.

There are two options for this task:

Setting the background as a shade of blue with your text white OR

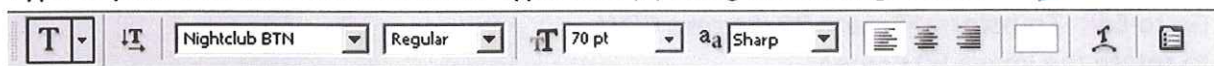
Setting the background white and your text as a shade of blue.



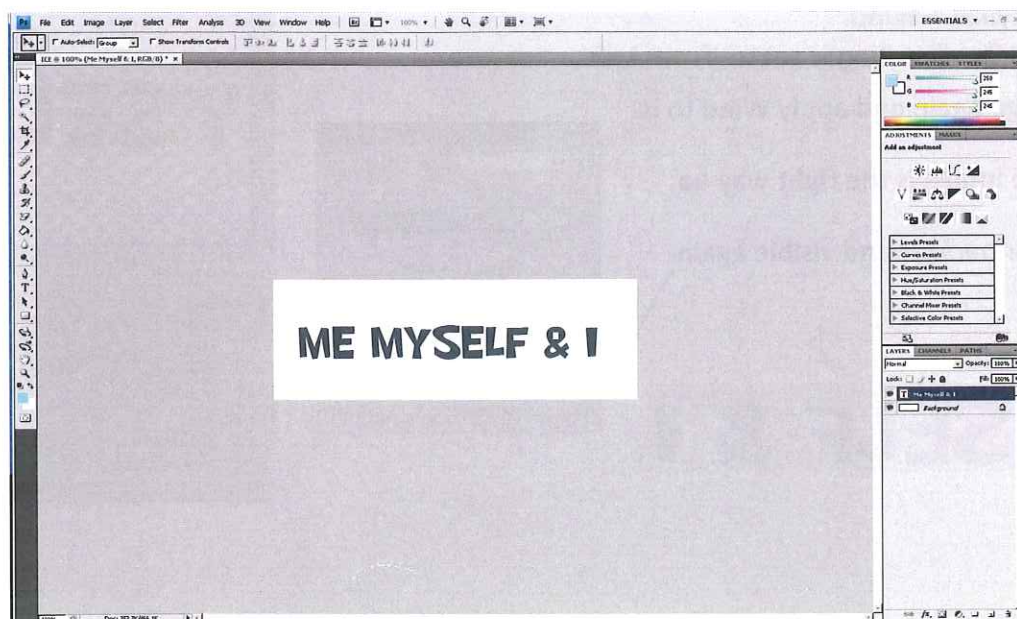
Having set the Background colour to either white or blue.

Type in your text with the Horizontal Type Tool (T) using the settings below.

Text Colour



Click on the text layer and choose **LAYER > Rasterize > Type > Layer**

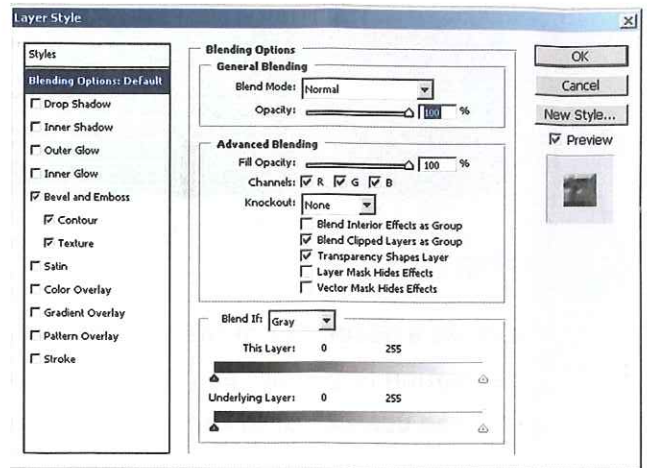


Then right click on the layer and choose **Blending Options**.

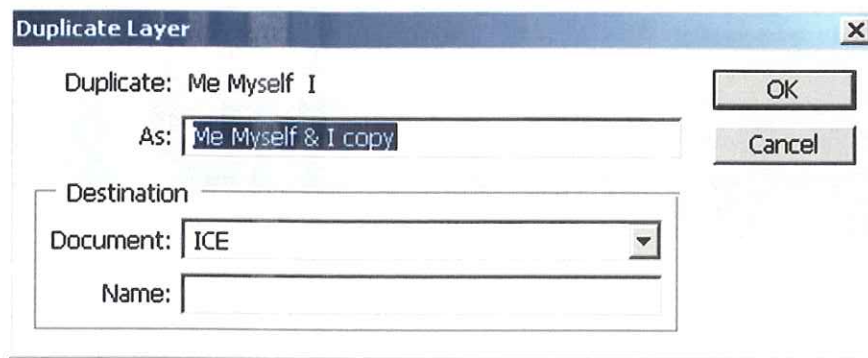
Tick in **Layer Styles**

1. Bevel and Emboss
- Contour
- Texture

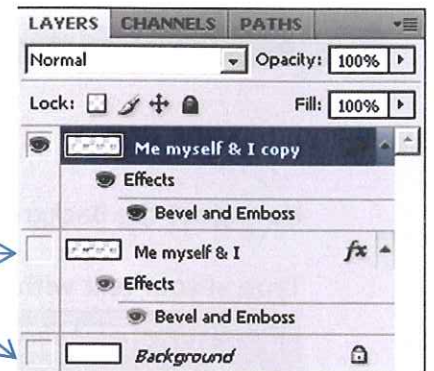
Then **OK**.

Duplicate the layer that the image is on by right clicking it and choosing **Duplicate layer**.



When you duplicated turn off the visibility to the other layers.

Go to **Edit>Transform>Rotate 90 degrees CCW**, to rotate the image 90 degrees.

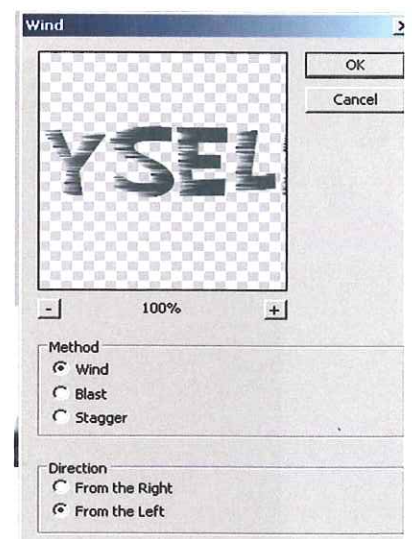
Goto **Filter > Stylize > Wind**.

Make sure that the direction is set to '**From Left**'.

Rotate the image again and apply Wind to it.

Rotate until the image is the right way up.

Then make your background visible again.
