



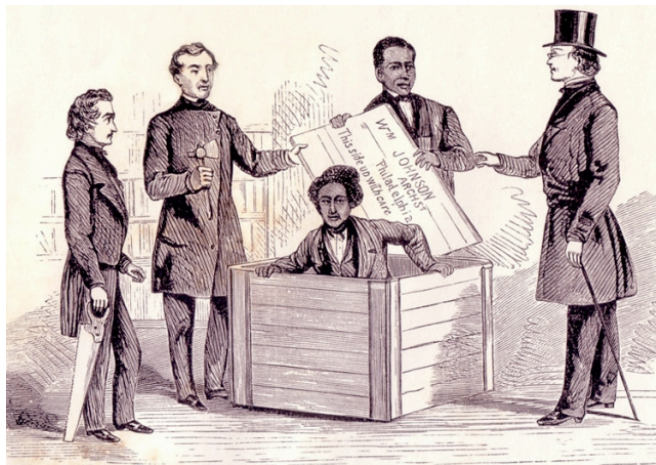
# Path to Freedom Teacher Institute
