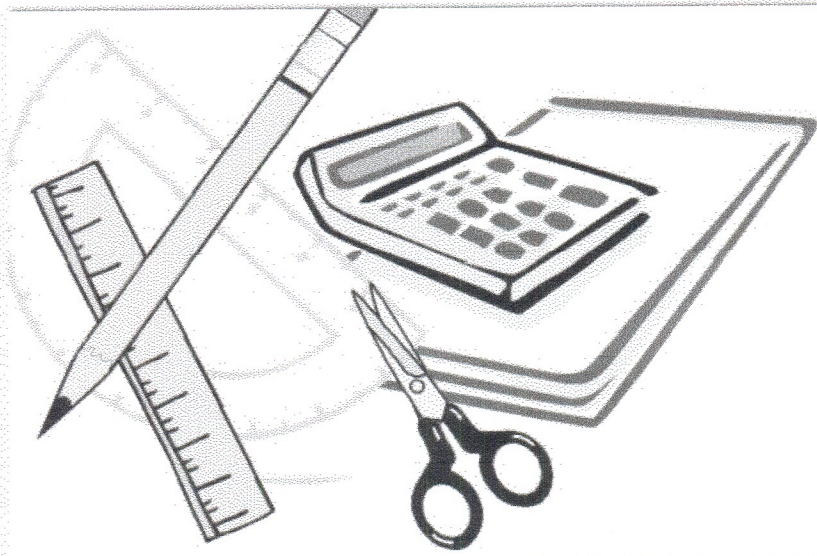
I have three classrooms:
