Sampling Technique

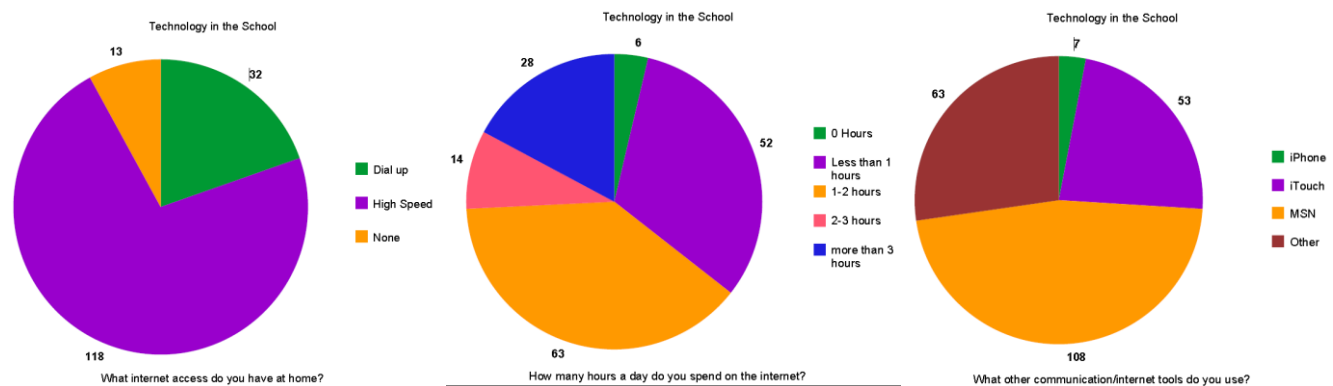
The surveys were distributed to MSIP classes and completed by students on a voluntary basis.

Survey Statistics

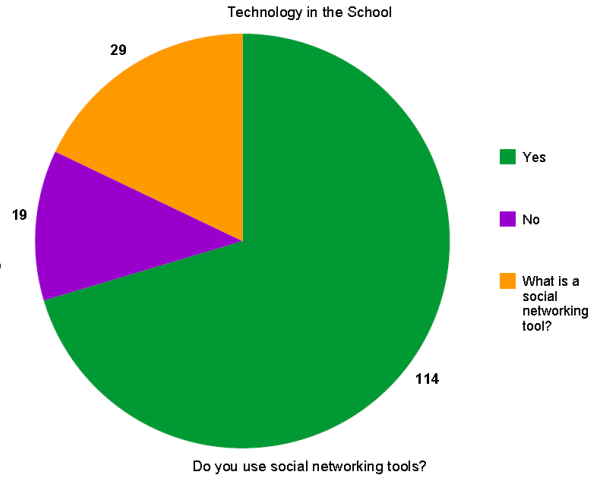
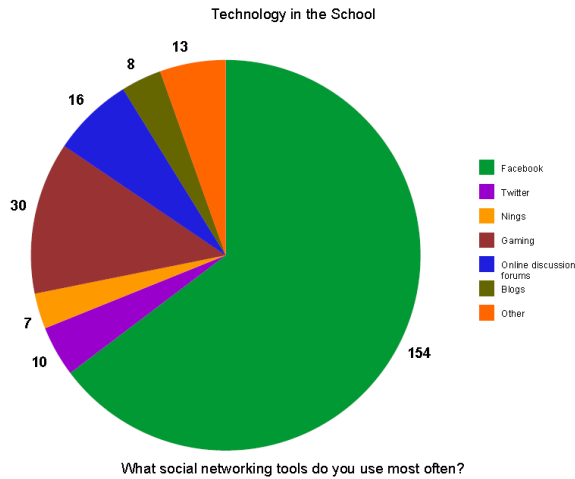
Population – 384 students

Sample Size – 163 students

Survey Results



- 67% of students use the internet at home
- 70% spend up to two hours per day on the internet
- 28% have no internet access at home OR dial-up



- Most students use some type of social networking tool; Facebook and gaming tools are the most popular
- Smartboards, You Tube, Prezi, Blogs, Online Surveys, Movie Maker, and Photoshop are the tools that students most like to use in the classroom or would like to know more about
