a feathered plume on a helmet; , distinctive and stylish elegance

taper (noun)

1a : a slender candle b : a long waxed wick used especially for lighting candles, lamps, pipes, or fires c : a feeble light
2a : a tapering form or figure b : gradual diminution of thickness, diameter, or width in an elongated object c : a gradual decrease

taper (adj.)

1: progressively narrowed toward one end
2: furnished with or adjusted to a scale : graduated <taper freight rates>

intransitive verb
1: to become progressively smaller toward one end
2: to diminish gradually

full of trivial conversation

carnage

1: the flesh of slain animals or men
2: great and usually bloody slaughter or injury

a feud in which members of the opposing parties

bellwether

someone who assumes leadership of a movement
or activity; the male sheep that leads the flock to
the slaughterhouse; a leader, as in a desperate or
violent undertaking; an indicator of trends,

coalesce

mix together different elements,
combine; fuse

mottled

marked with spots of different
color

vanguard

the position of greatest advancement, any
creative group active in the innovation and
application of new concepts and techniques in a
given field (especially in the arts), the foremost
part of an army; the leading position in any field

abate

become less in amount or intensity, make less
active or intense, to lessen in violence or
intensity

delectable

extremely pleasing to the sense of taste, very
pleasing; delightful, pleasing to the senses,
especially to the sense of taste; delicious

blandishment

the act of urging by means of teasing or flattery, a flattering act or remark; allurement; enticement

condescend

debase oneself morally, act in an undignified, unworthy, or dishonorable way

motley

a collection containing a variety of sorts of things; having sections or patches colored differently and usually brightly

brio

quality of being active or spirited or alive and vigorous; enthusiasm

inveigle

influence or urge by gentle urging, caressing, or flattering; to obtain by deception or flattery

servile

submissive or fawning in attitude or behavior; overly submissive, (adj.) of or relating to a slave; behaving like or suitable for a slave or a servant, menial; lacking spirit or independence, abjectly submissive

array

an impressive display; an arrangement of objects in rows and columns; especially fine or decorative clothing

kowtow

a former Chinese custom of touching the ground with the forehead as a sign of respect or submission; try to gain favor by cringing or flattering

secluded

hidden; removed; sheltered, isolated from others

pandemonium

a state of extreme confusion and disorder, chaos, a wild uproar, din, or commotion

reticent

reluctant to draw attention to yourself; inclined
to keep silent; reserved

: to exercise arbitrary or overbearing control
