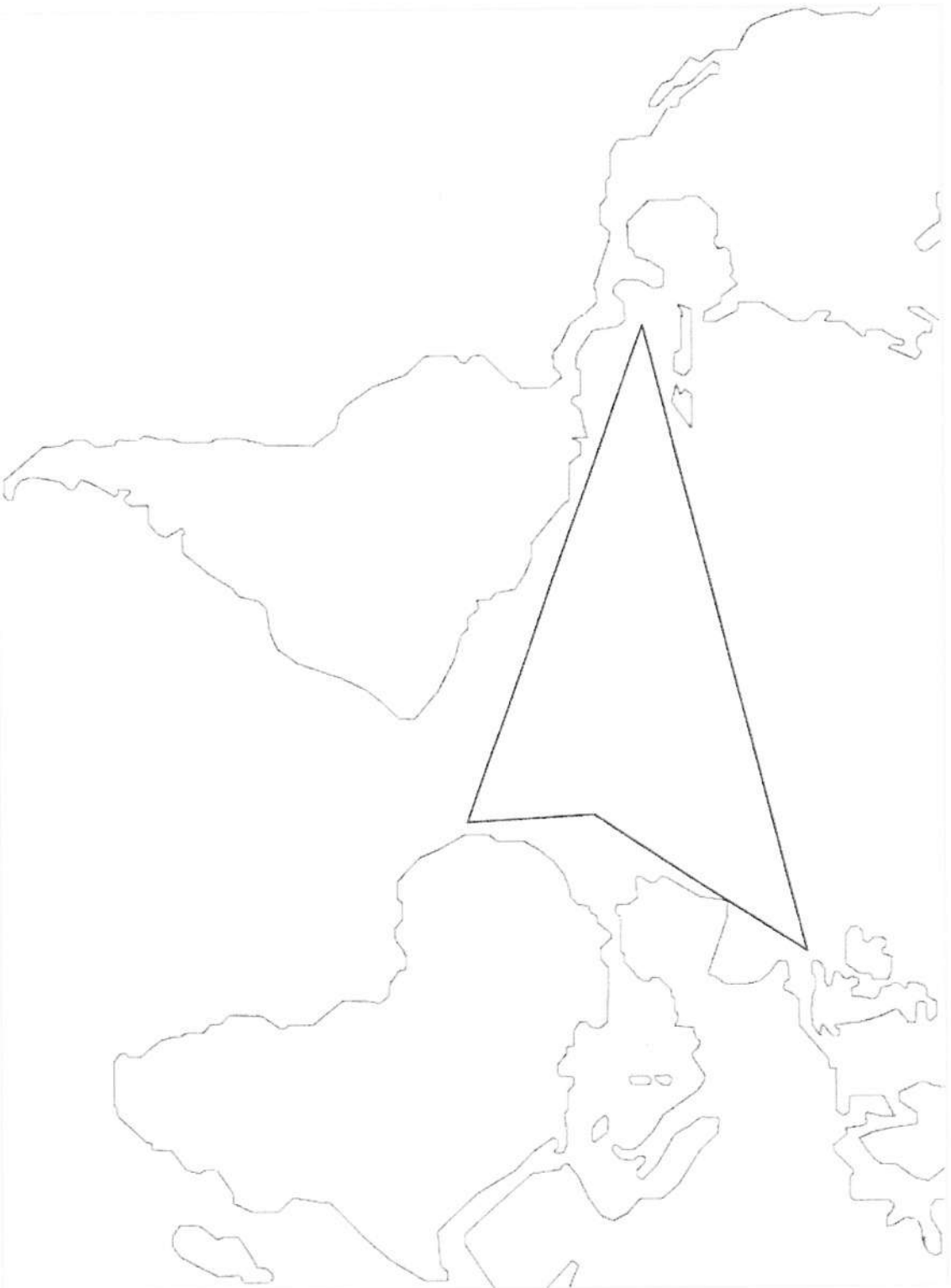

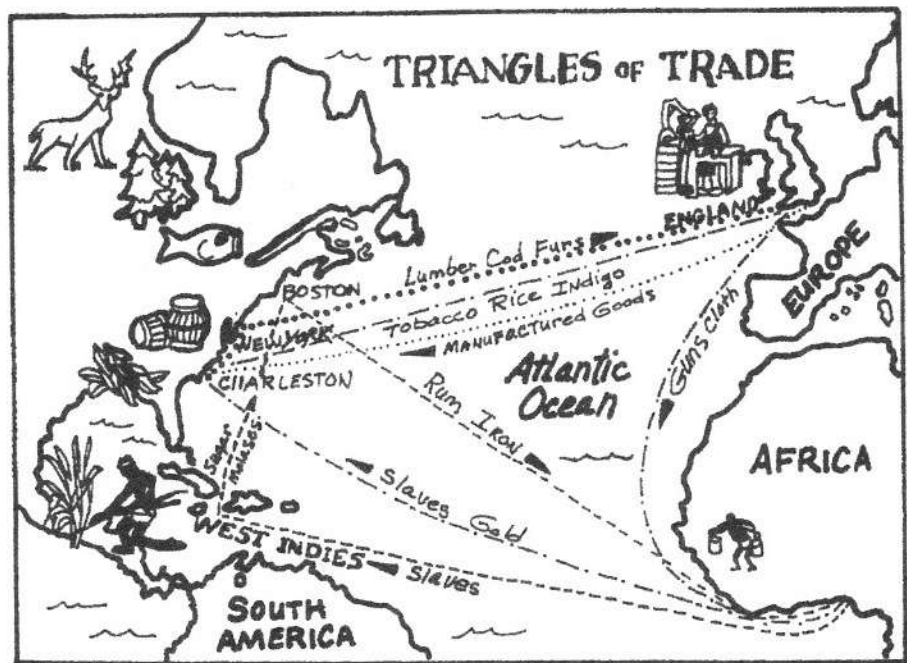

Triangular Trade

Look carefully at the map. Notice the three-sided figures made by the lines between the colonies, Europe, and Africa. The resulting triangles made up what is known as "triangular trade." All of the countries were interconnected by slave trade. In addition, goods from the colonies were traded in England. From there, ships traveled to Africa to trade goods for slaves. Then ships went back to the West Indies and the home port. To help you learn more about this triangular trade, follow the directions below.
