

- Dutch smelting outsourced to India & China (very little capacity in Europe)
- > Materials are shipped to China (after collected, sorted by A4M and others)

- e-waste almost no financial gain in new laptops

- old computers lot of financial gain bc. raw materials reusable are always disassembled

- 'Metals are worth money, waste costs money'

↳ who pays whom and for what? what has value and to whom?

- taking products / waste apart is not done by machines because every object is treated individually

- different clients: government, gemeente, but also Maersk (Military? / Weapons) industry

- weee-label: certificate for e-waste taking apart (mandatory)

- there is also European standard

- there are different 'levels' on which you as company are allowed to take apart devices (for example fridge, very high level bc. there is environmental danger gas involved)

electricity The Netherlands can't keep up with electricity demands of electrical cars, cranes etc. (takes 11 more years)

- 'from waste / garbage to re-sources' (?)

- company transparency reports (SRD) (about processes, emissions etc. to clients so they can be transparent)

- for e-waste: preventing to let parts enter black market (bc highly valuable)
