1. Repeating information over and over again to keep from forgetting (maintenance rehearsal)
2. Context-dependent memories
3. Using and auditory code as a way of remembering things, like letters for example.
4. State-dependent memories.
5. Tip-of-the-tongue phenomenon.
6. Uses this type of coding, “relating to meaning”, to represent information in terms of its meaning.
7. Making information more meaningful by relating it to information you already know.
8. Attempting to memorize something by seeing it in your mind.
9. Organizing new information into certain groups according to common features.
10. “Filing errors” can occur here when we file information incorrectly.
