SIXTH MEETING ANOTHER HIGHLY SUCCESSFUL AND WELL-ATTENDED EVENT

The 6th Meeting of the Heads of Road Authorities (HORA), held in Gyeonggi-do, Korea on May 9 & 10, 2007 has been successfully concluded with the attendance of 66 delegates from 13 countries.

Two ministers, one deputy minister, one assistant minister and 13 heads of road authorities were among the delegates who attended the two-day HORA meeting. The 13 participating countries are Australia, Brunei, Indonesia, Japan, Korea, Malaysia, New Zealand, Pakistan, the Philippines, Singapore, Sri Lanka, Thailand, and Vietnam. The meeting was hosted by Korea and jointly organised by the Korea Road and Transportation Association, KRTA and the REAAA Korean Chapter with the support of the Korean Department of Construction & Transportation.

The 6th HORA meeting focused its attention on one topic 'Disaster Risk Management' which has generated great interest among the delegates. Two main papers on the same topic, one by Malaysia and another by Korea, were presented, sharing with HORA delegates, their experiences and ideas on the issue. Following the two presentations, the delegates were divided into seven groups to debate the topic further and to produce a record of recommendations, solutions and actions plans.

To take follow-up actions on the recommendations and action plans, it has been agreed that a working committee be set up. The formation of this working committee is one of the positive outcomes of the 6th HORA meeting. Each committee member is responsible for coordinating the retrieval of relevant information applicable to their region.

Members of the working committee are expected to be invited to attend its first committee meeting scheduled to be held in November 2007 in Kuala Lumpur in conjunction with the 84th meeting of the REAAA Governing Council.

The 83rd Meeting of the REAAA Governing Council has been successfully held on 10 May 2007 in Gyeonggi-do, Korea. The Meeting has been described as very fruitful as it has made several important decisions to further strengthen REAAA. It was attended by 22 Council members and two special guests.

The Meeting has adopted a proposal to strengthen the REAAA Secretariat with the objective of providing better services to its members. The REAAA Website will be re-designed, making it more informative and effective in achieving the goals set. The Post Conference Report of the 12th REAAA Conference held in Manila in November 2006 was also presented to the Council. Decisions were made on the Katahira Awards and its amended entry rules. The meeting was informed that funding for the Mino Roadshow has been approved and the workshops with the objective to transfer technology on road engineering will be held soon for countries in the Pacific as well as Vietnam. The Meeting accepted the proposal to name the most prestigious of the keynote address at each future REAAA Conference as 'Mah Guan Seng Oration', in honour of the contribution of the late Mr. Mah to REAAA.

• Well-Attended

Sixty-six delegates from 13 countries attended the 6th HORA meeting jointly organised and hosted by the Korea Road and Transportation Association, KRTA and the REAAA Korean Chapter with the support of the Korean Department of Construction & Transportation.

Among the dignitaries who graced the opening session were two ministers, one deputy minister, one assistant minister and 13 heads of road authorities. The Minister of Highways, Pakistan, Mr. Muhammed Shamim Siddiqui, The Minister for Communications, Sri Lanka, Mr. T B Ekanayake; Undersecretary of the Philippines Public Works and Highways, Mr. Bashir Rasuman; The Assistant Minister of Construction and Transportation, Korea, Mr. Hae-Sung Hwang, and Mr. Hak-Lae Son, President of Korea Road and Transportation Association and President of Korea Expressway Corporation.

The HORA Meeting was one of the concurrent events held in conjunction with the International Road & Traffic Expo 2007 at KINTEX, Gyeonggi-do, Korea. The Korean hosts and organisers have extended invitation to ministers in 15 countries in the region for them to attend and grace

the Expo and the HORA Meeting. 22 REAAA Council members were among the HORA delegates.

The 6th HORA meeting was chaired by REAAA President, Dr. Kyong-Soo Yoo. He said Korea was honoured to host and organize this meeting which again saw the active participation of heads of road authorities in this region.

The 13 participating countries are Australia, Brunei, Indonesia, Japan, Korea, Malaysia, New Zealand, Pakistan, the Philippines, Singapore, Sri Lanka, Thailand, and Vietnam.

• Well Prepared

The HORA delegates were well-prepared for the meeting as they have been notified months earlier of the topic 'Disaster Risk Management' for discussions. An abstract on the topic, the format for the meeting together with the invitation letter and other relevant information have earlier been circulated to all the participants. The topic has generated much interest among the HORA delegates in the wake of a number of devastations caused by natural disasters such as tsunami catastrophe and the recent severe floods experienced in this region.

SIXTH HORA MEETING

• More Focus

The HORA meeting this time focused its attention on the workshop on `Disaster Risk Management`. The workshop began with the presentation of two main papers, one by Malaysia while the other one by Korea, soon after the opening session.

The Malaysian Paper, prepared and presented by Dr. Safry Kamal Ahmad, covered key issues including natural disasters, strategic actions, recovery process, and levels of involvement of government agencies. Recommendations and solutions were proposed in the conclusion.

Dr. Safry, in presenting his paper proposed to set up a panel which can identify mechanisms, procedures for the rapid response that is able:

- To enhance awareness and preparedness among member countries and concerned agencies and authorities,
- To assist to promptly assess damage, identify provisional repairs necessary, and oversee the execution of these repairs,
- To collaborate to make known a coordinated plan to minimize the adverse impact of natural disasters,
- To support to implement measures and actions to ensure immediate emergency repairs to at least partially restore the functionality of access roads to affected areas, and
- To render assistance to governments lacking needed resources as may be necessary.

Dr. Safry said the proposed organization becomes necessary considering that more often than not the global response to such disasters is often immediate and massive, but not always channeled to be as coordinated and efficient as would be desirable. The mechanism must also be able to deal with road access problems in a coordinated and efficient manner considering that all too often key

access roads have themselves been severely damaged, and rendered impassable.

The Korean Paper was prepared by Dr. Heungbae Gil and Dr. Byungok Yoo of Korea Expressway Corporation. Dr. Gil in presenting the paper said disaster risk management can be defined as a series of actions and systems expressly aimed at reducing disaster risks in endangered regions and mitigating the extent of disasters. It includes risk assessment, disaster prevention and mitigation and disaster preparedness.

Korea Expressway Corporation (KEC) is also experiencing increased natural and man-made disaster risk. Natural disasters such as storm, typhoon, and heavy rains and snows have affected operation of expressways and safety of users. A few years ago thousands of cars were stranded on an expressway more than a day due to heavy snow. Last year storm caused debris flow, which in turn inundated the expressway. Man-made disasters such as fire in the tunnel and bridge also caused road closures.

KEC is taking series of actions to reduce disaster risk and increase disaster preparedness. It implemented a Disaster Management Manual. The main purpose of the Manual is to provide timely, factual and useful information on disaster mitigation and response and traffic control. The Manual covers the following major topics in detail: lists, countermeasures, and preparedness of natural and man-made disasters; traffic control and detour plans; public information; response plans for respective disasters.

KEC also developed an internet-based Disaster Management Information System (DMIS), which includes the digital map with a disaster-prevention GIS and a disaster risk map. The DMIS was developed to effectively manage disasters and deliver the information on disaster situations. It enables real-time disaster situation control and response according to the Manual. It also helps to monitor disaster-prone areas and exchange real-time disaster site information among stakeholders.

SIXTH HORA MEETING

Active Participation

Following the presentations, the delegates were divided into seven groups to actively debate the topic further and to produce a record of recommendations, solutions and action plans. Each group was asked to address the following issues in their discussions.

- Definition of 'disaster'
- Management of disasters: current practice
- Role of REAAA in disaster risk management
- How could this be achieved? Should an REAAA Secretariat be established?
- Topics to be addressed in a 'Disaster Risk Management Compendium'
- General comments and topics for future Compendiums



The delegates divided into seven groups debating seriously the topic 'Disaster Risk Management' to produce a record of recommendations, solutions and action plans.

A Group Leader was appointed from each group who presented the outcomes of the discussions when the meeting re-convened. The Chairman of the Technical Committee, Kieran Sharp, was asked to lead the group discussions and prepare a report summarising the findings based on the above issues.

Follow-Up Actions

To take follow-up actions on the recommendations and action plans, it has been agreed to set up a working committee. The formation of this working committee is one of the positive outcomes of the 6th HORA meeting. Each committee member is also responsible for coordinating the retrieval of relevant information applicable to their region.

Members of the working committee are expected to be invited to attend its first committee meeting scheduled to be held in November 2007 in Kuala Lumpur in conjunction with the 84th meeting of the REAAA Governing Council.

HORA Advisory Panel

The 6th HORA Meeting was briefed on the progress of the HORA Advisory Panel on Privatisation of Highways and Road facilities. In efforts to obtain the relevant information, the Panel, through the REAAA Secretariat, has sent out a standard questionnaire to the heads of road authorities in the region. Responses were received from 12 countries - Australia, India, Indonesia, Japan, Korea, Nepal, New Zealand, Philippines, Malaysia, Singapore, Taiwan and Thailand.

The Panel, headed by the Director General of the Malaysian Highway Authority are analysing the results. The information received will also be used to compile a handbook to be circulated to the HORAs.

The Deputy Director-General of the Malaysian Highway Authority Mr. Ismail Md. Salleh represented the Panel Chairman in briefing the HORA delegates. He said the findings covered various issues including those on 'Development of Policy', 'Privatisation Implementation' and 'Privatisation Enhancements-Highway in Operation'. The challenges in managing privatisation faced by some countries were highlighted in his briefing.

The Governing Council, working with the Katahira Fund Committee and the Technical Committee, has agreed to develop a proposal for the funding of an award for authors of original, outstanding papers published in the REAAA Journal.

It has been proposed to be known as the 'Katahira Journal Award' which is to be presented to author/s for contributing the best journal paper of the year.

This was approved by the Governing Council at its 83rd meeting on May 10, 2007 in Korea. The entry rules and other details on this new award are being worked out. An announcement will be made after the approval of the Governing Council. It is hoped to attract more quality papers to be published in the REAAA Journal. REAAA publishes two issues of the Journal each year.

The meeting also decided that the existing Katahira Award will be called the 'Katahira Conference Award' which will be presented to winners in conjunction with the REAAA Conferences. The REAAA Conference is held every two to four years. For the recently held 12th REAAA Conference in Manila, six winners were picked to receive the award for contributing the best paper, the outstanding paper and the four highly commended papers. The prize money totalling about US\$ 2,500.00, was presented to the winners.

Entry Rules Revised

The entry rules for the Katahira Conference Award have been revised and simplified as follows:

- To be eligible for the Katahira Award, either the first author or the second author (if there are multiple authors) must be under 40 years of age at the time of the submission of the paper and must be an Ordinary/Associate member of REAAA or an employee of an organization which is an Institutional Member of REAAA or associated with the above-stated member/employee as co-author.
- The paper must not have been published elsewhere in the same form.

The proposal for the revised entry rules was presented at the 83rd Council meeting by the Chairman of the Katahira Committee, Mr. Yasumasa Torii. The proposal was adopted.

Background

The Katahira Award was established in 1991 in memory of the late Dr. Nobutaka Katahira who was the Association's President for the 5th Council term from 1983 to 1986. He willed 3 million Yen to the REAAA towards encouraging keen participation among young engineers in the promotion and advancement of science and technology in road development and road-related engineering. The Governing Council for the 6th term decided to use the donation to set up the Katahira Fund for the award. Dr. Katahira's followers had in October 2000 donated an additional sum of £ 19,080.12 to the Fund.

So far, about US\$ 13,500.00 has been given out to the recipients since the inaugural Katahira Awards presentation was held in the year 1992. The Awards were also presented in 1995, 1998, 2000, 2003 and 2006.

Tributes to the late Mr. Mah Guan Seng

The Council, at its 83rd Meeting in Korea, paid tributes to Mr. Mah Guan Seng who passed away on 3 December 2006 after a short illness. REAAA President Dr. Kyong-Soo Yoo who chaired the meeting said the Council had lost a dear friend. He described Mr. Mah as a loyal Council member who had never missed a Council meeting and a founder member who had served the Association for more than 32 years. Mr. Mah's total commitment and unfailing support has positively nurtured the Association to international prominence. In appreciation of his significant services and contributions, Mr. Mah was elected as the 10th Honorary member of REAAA in May 1998.

REAAA has extended its deepest condolence to the family of the late Mr. Mah. It has featured an obituary and a special write up in the December 2006 REAAA Newsletter.

Dr. Yoo said Mr. Mah's services and contributions to the growth of REAAA will always be remembered and appreciated by all the members. He then invited Council members who were present at the meeting to observe a minute of silence as a mark of respect for the late Mr. Mah.

HORA DELEGATES ARE IMPRESSED WITH INCHEON BRIDGE CONSTRUCTION PROJECT

HORA delegates and REAAA Council members were deeply impressed with Korea's Incheon Bridge project during their technical tour of the construction site of the project on 11 May 2007 in conjunction with the 6th HORA Meeting in Gyeonggi-do. The delegates were briefed on the engineering technologies, special features and other aspects of the project before taking them for the site visit.

The project is an expressway of 21.27 km with 6 lanes consisting of 18.2 km long Incheon Bridge and 3.07 km long embankment road to connect Incheon International Airport in Yeongjong Island International Free Economic Zone of New Songdo City in Incheon Metropolitan City. The Incheon Bridge, the longest and largest bridge in Korea and among 5 longest bridges of its kind in the world, will be opened to traffic by October 2009. This new landmark of Asia is expected to play the role as a driving force in developing the future-oriented high-technology. Incheon Bridge will be the core infrastructure to accelerate Korea's transition into economic-hub in North East Asia, in the 21st Century.



The project costing about US\$ 2.5 billion, is being funded by private investment (US\$ 1.7 billion) and the Korean Government (US\$ 0.8 billion). KODA Development, a joint venture between the British company AMEC and the City of Incheon is a concessionaire of the private investment section, while SAMSUNG JV, a group of seven domestic builders, has taken charge of the design and construction. 7 Joint ventures of leading domestic contractors have joined in the government financed section. KOREA EXPRESSWAY CORPORATION, a government-established public corporation has managed all sections on behalf of the Korean Government.
