EXPRESSING QUANTITY	
countable nouns	uncountable nouns
How many coins has she got?	How much luggage have you got?
She hasn't got many coins.	We haven't got much luggage.
But I have got lots of coins.	But they have got lots of luggage

Use **many** with countables and **much** with uncountables.

You can use **lots of** with both.

SOME / ANY	
countable nouns	uncountable nouns
Have you got any newspapers?	Have you got any butter?
We haven't got any newspapers, but we have got some magazines	We haven't got any butter, but we have only got some jam.

Use **any** for **questions and negative** sentences.

Use **some** for **positive** sentences.

Unit 9

INFINITIVE OF PURPOSE	
I turned on the TV to watch a cartoon.	We go to school to learn about the world.

Use **to + the base form** of the verb for a purpose or a reason.

To + base form = infinitive (e.g. to watch – to learn)

HOW OFTEN....?	
How often do you watch TV?	I watch TV every day .
How often do you ride a bike?	I ride a bike three times a week .
How often do you drive a car?	I never drive a car.
How often do you play computer games?	I play computer games twice a week .

1 time = **once**

2 times = **twice**
