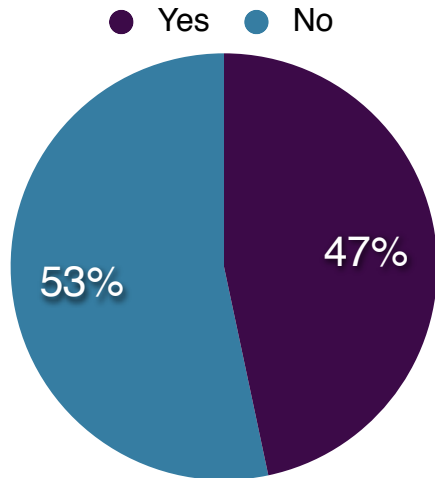


Junior Perspective on Cyber Safety.

Please note that this is based on one class. This although is probably a good indication of our junior school's learning with cyber safety.

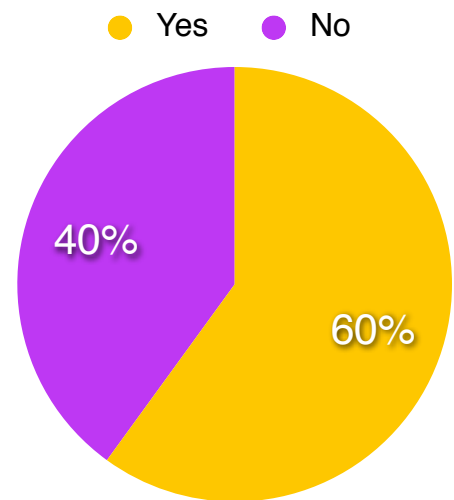
We were concerned that there was a high percentage of children in the junior school that would act in an unsafe manner online.



Almost half would share their last name online. (Results to the left).

One third of our students would give their phone number or address to someone online.

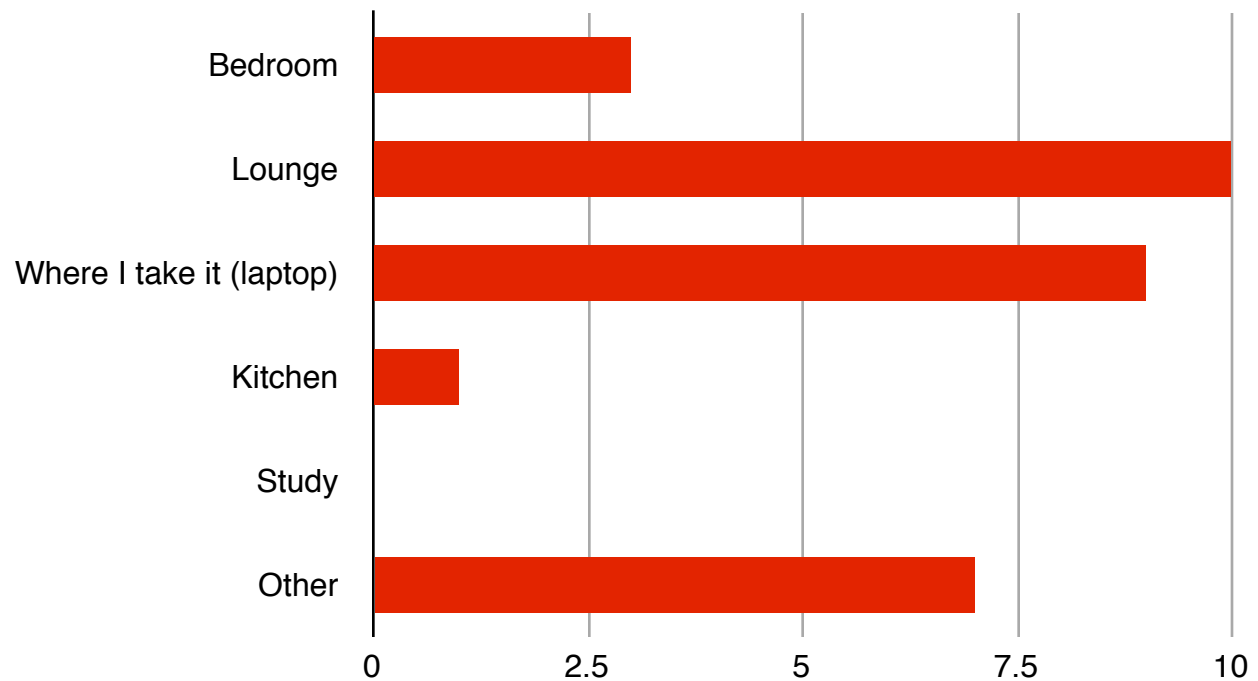
More than half of our junior students thought it would be OK to friend someone online that they did not know in real life.



No students indicated that they were a member of an online social networking site like facebook, club penguin or Bebo.

We were quite concerned about the amount of information that our junior students would give out over the internet. We know that we have a good stranger danger programme at our school and we see that this needs to extend to strangers online.

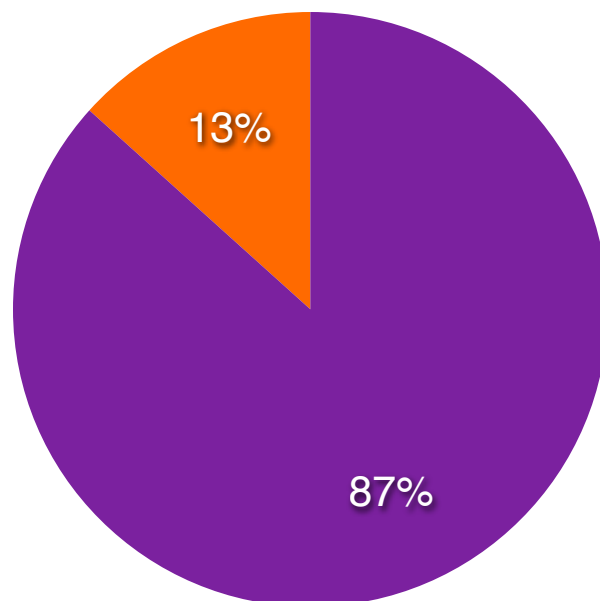
Where is your computer at home?



All but one of the students surveyed had computer access at home and 9 of these had a laptop. Only 1/5 had a mobile device that was used at home.

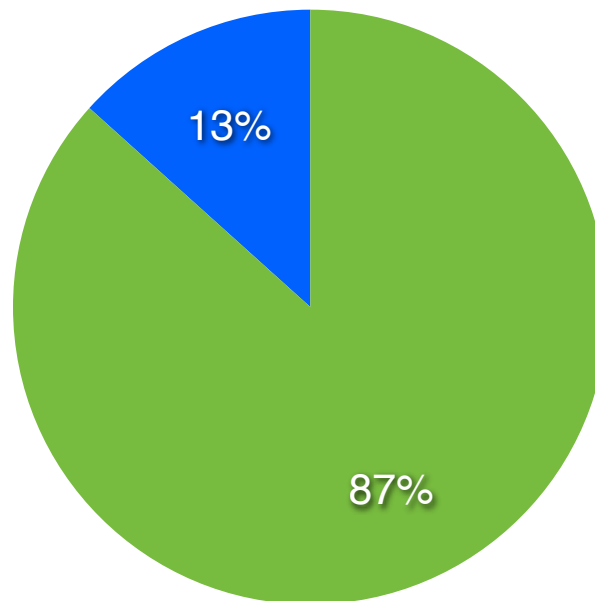
Do you have the internet at home?

Some of the rules are;

We felt that many of the rules here were fairly rudimentary and had a lot to do with hardware. We wondered if there were so many restrictions on what the children did on the computer/internet that there was no need for further rules.

The 'have to stay on your games' comment leads us to thinking that the children has rules about where and what they can do on the computer and this is well monitored.

***3/4 of our students were allowed to use the computer by themselves.
If they were to see something rude they said they would ignore it, don't look at it
and tell someone.***
