

Three modes of communication

- Interpersonal
- Interpretive
- Presentational



Interpersonal Mode



- two-way oral or written communication
- negotiation / clarification of meaning is possible
- often spontaneous in nature

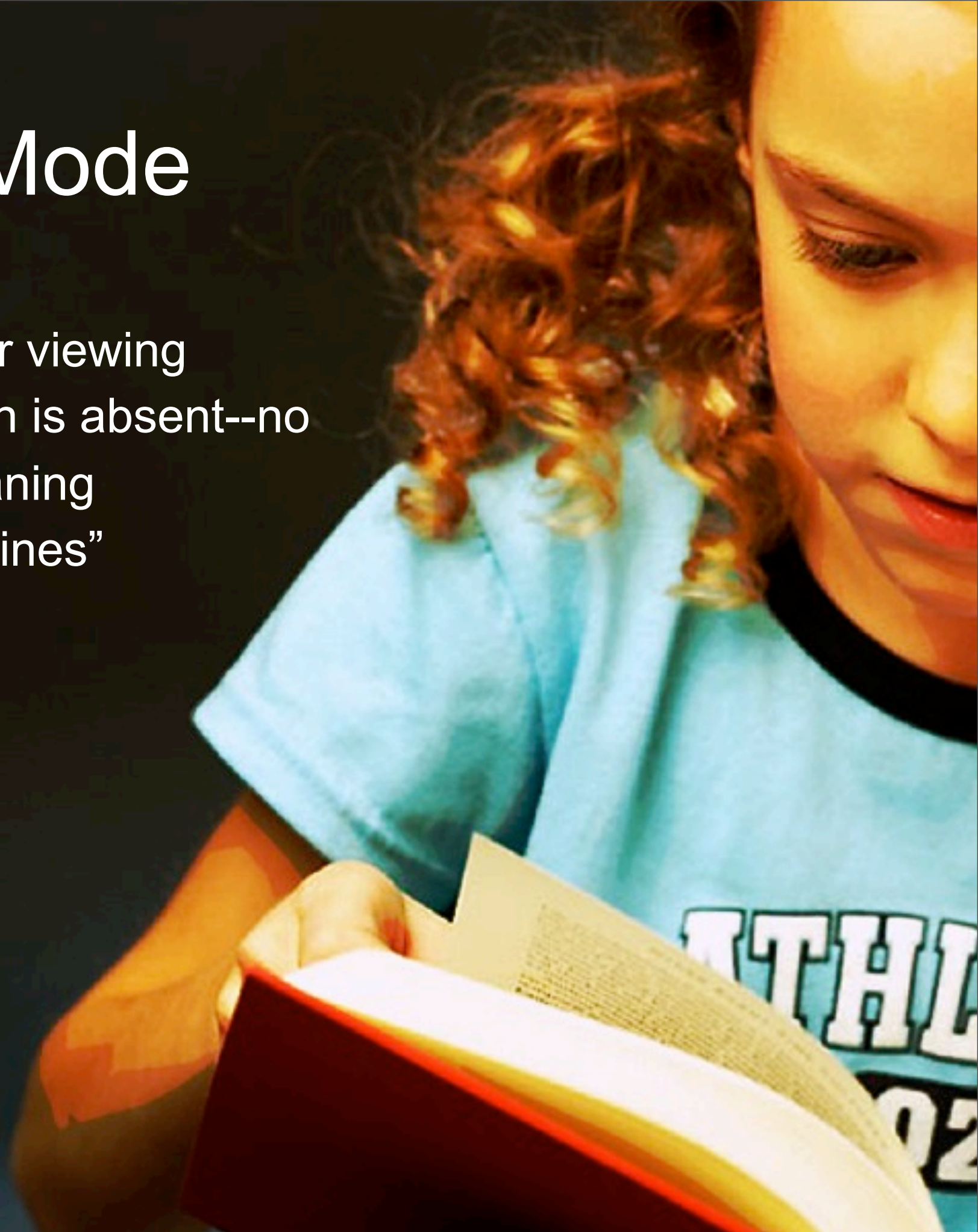
(Interpersonal Communication)



Students engage in conversations, provide and obtain information, express feelings and emotions, and exchange opinions.

Interpretive Mode

- one-way reading, listening or viewing
- creator of the communication is absent--no opportunity to negotiate meaning
- ability to “read between the lines”



Standard 1.2

(Interpretive Communication)

Students understand and interpret written and spoken language on a variety of topics.



Presentational Mode



- formal, one-way communication to an audience of listeners or readers
- possible opportunity to prepare or rehearse

Standard 1.3

(Presentational Communication)



Students present information, concepts, and ideas to an audience of listeners or readers on a variety of topics.
