*Remember, you can plug these projectors into a wide variety of video and audio devices. Their versatility is matched by their portability, easily moving from room to room as needed.*



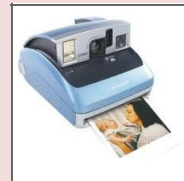
## VCR player

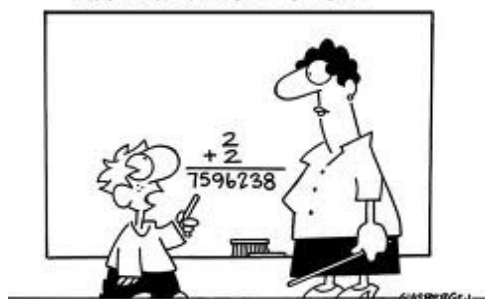


## Polaroid Camera
