## Bus Information

During the past several years we have had an increase in the number of requests for students to ride to or from school on a different bus, because of accountability and safety concerns, students are not permitted to ride a bus other than the one assigned to them by our county's transportation department. If there are circumstances that make it necessary for your child to go home with another student, please make alternative arrangements such as having a parent pick them up from school or the public library.



## Telephones and Messages

The telephones located in the Main Office are intended to receive incoming calls, for use by faculty and staff, and for **emergency** calls by students. The office staff will relay family-related **emergency** messages from a parent/guardian to their son/daughter only. No messages will be taken for students from anyone other than a parent/guardian. Please make every effort to discuss your student's plan for the day BEFORE he/she comes to school. Classes are interrupted and valuable instruction time is lost when they are called out to receive messages.



## School Absence/Makeup Work

Always remember to send in a note when your child returns to school after a day or more absence. If he/she has seen a doctor be sure to send in the doctor's excuse slip. For family vacations, please send in a request to excuse the absence for those days **at least one week prior to the start of the vacation**. Vacation requests received AFTER the vacation has taken place will NOT be approved. Also please be aware that no more than 5 days per school year will be excused for family vacation.

You may request makeup work when a student is absent for **three or more days** (if a student is absent for less than three days he/she will get the missed work directly from teachers upon return). For absences of three days or more, call the Guidance Office to request makeup work. The work will be available for pickup after 3:00 p.m. the following school day. Your request can be made as soon as you are aware that your child will be out for more than three days

## Language Arts

As the second marking period gets rolling, sixth grade Language Arts will be transitioning from our Contributions unit to Patterns. We are currently wrapping up our contributions unit as we finish reading Theodore Boone: Kid Lawyer by John Grisham. As we wrap up our novel, we will be able to launch our Patterns unit as we look at our novel, we will be able to launch our Patterns unit as we look at Theodore Boone and his family's life patterns. Once our unit is underway, we will be able to focus on characters, real world, and text patterns and how patterns contribute to change, behaviors, outcome, results, new perspectives, etc. As we analyze patterns, we will develop our writing skills focusing on informational writing and looking at its structure and patterns.

In eighth grade language arts students are wrapping up their first unit, Contributions, and

moving to their second unit, Change, in which they will examine the ways that people and things evolve, shift, and endure by reading a variety of selections, both fiction and nonfiction. We will continue to help students build strong speaking and listening skills through regular participation in the Touchstones discussion program. We have already seen great progress and are confident that students will show even more growth as we carry on.



## Attendance Policy

Students are permitted up to 5 unlawful absences per marking period without consequences. Parents will be notified by letter when a student has accumulated more than 5 unlawful absences per marking period.

## Tardy Policy

The expectation is that students are in homeroom by 7:40 a.m. ready to start the day. Students arriving to homeroom past 7:40 a.m. are considered tardy up to 10:33 a.m. Students are permitted up to 3 tardies each marking period. Consequences for more than 3 tardies are as follows:

4th Tardy a letter will be sent home to parents.

5th Tardy a detention will be given.

6th Tardy the student will be placed in MIP.

Continuing consequences for further infractions.

## News from the Nurse's Office

### Actions to Fight The Flu

#### Take time to get a flu vaccine.

\*CDC recommends a yearly flu vaccine as the first and most important step in protecting against flu viruses.

\*Everyone 6 months of age and older should get a flu vaccine as soon as the vaccines are available. Especially those at high risk such as young children and people with chronic health conditions such as asthma and diabetes. Children younger than 6 months are too young to be vaccinated. Caregivers should be vaccinated instead.

#### Take actions to stop the spread of germs.

\*Cover your nose and mouth with a tissue when you cough or sneeze.

\*Wash your hands often with soap and water or use alcohol-based hand rub.

\*Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth. Germs spread this way.

\*If you are sick with flu-like illness, CDC recommends that you stay home for at least 24 hours after your fever is gone except to get medical care or for other

necessities. (Your fever should be gone without the use of a fever-reducing medicine.)

#### Take flu antiviral drugs if your doctor prescribes them.

\*If you get the flu, antiviral drugs can treat your illness. Antiviral drugs can make illness milder and shorten the time you are sick.

\*Flu-like symptoms include fever, cough, sore throat, runny or stuffy nose, body aches, headache, chills and fatigue. Some people also may have vomiting and diarrhea.

People may be infected with the flu, and have respiratory symptoms without a fever.



## Dances

All school dances are for PVMS students only. Students from other schools may not attend. Courteous and respectful behavior will be expected at all dances. Inappropriate and/or harmful dancing will not be allowed. School rules apply during after school dances such as dress code, cell phones and gum. Attending a school dance is a privilege and an administrator may revoke that privilege, prior to the dance, if a student's school behavior is deemed inappropriate. Students must also have all financial obligations to PVMS paid in order to attend a school dance. All dances are from 2:45-4:45 p.m. Transportation arrangements need to be made in advance with a parent/guardian. Students must be picked up promptly following dances.

## Math Zone

The Eighth Grade Math team has been working to incorporate the eight Standards for Mathematical Practice that the State of Maryland adopted. These "habits of mind" are strong reasoning and problem solving skills that research shows make students mathematically successful as well as successful citizens. Students are asked to MAKE SENSE of the PROBLEM and to PERSEVERE in solving them. Students should be able to REASON ABSTRACTLY and QUANTITATIVELY (make sense of quantities and relationships in problem situations). Students should be able to CONSTRUCT VIABLE ARGUMENTS and CRITIQUE the reasoning of others (using what they know to test and support their

solutions). Students are encouraged to make connections through solving real world problems, to MODEL with MATHEMATICS the skills they are learning. Students are asked to choose and USE APPROPRIATE TOOLS STRATEGICALLY, (knowing what, when and how to use a calculator, ruler, compass, etc). Students are asked to ATTEND TO PRECISION, not just getting the correct answer, but in stating their arguments and supporting their choices clearly and efficiently. We encourage students to LOOK FOR and

MAKE USE OF STRUCTURE, (finding patterns, representing quantities in different ways, and solving related problems based on these structures). Lastly, students are asked to LOOK FOR and EXPRESS REGULARITY in REPEATED REASONING, (look for and use general methods/shortcuts, checking for the reasonableness of an answer). As we work with these habits, teachers are stressing their importance in the math classroom, but also how they can and should be integrated in all areas of study.

## Physical Education

Beginning January 2, 2013 our Physical Education classes will be participating in an in-house roller skating program. The skates will be delivered directly to the school. 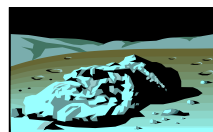

## FIRST MARKING PERIOD PBIS UPDATE

The students at PVMS had an awesome first marking period LIVING THE PERRYVILLE PLEDGE! As a result, we have some great news to share. Of the 565 students enrolled at PVMS, 551 were Green Zone students during the first quarter. That is an impressive 97.5%. The sixth grade led the way with an impressive 99.4%, followed by 7<sup>th</sup> grade at 98.8% and the eighth grade with a very respectable 94.9%. To be in the Green Zone, a student must not have had more than 2 office referrals. (Please note this includes bus referrals.) This will become a little more difficult as the year progresses as the referrals are carried from marking period to marking period.

We celebrated the Green Zone by heading to nearby Kilby Cream and had lots of fun and some great ice cream. While at Kilby's our students were able to explore the corn maze that was constructed in a castle theme, take a hay ride, roast marshmallows, show their skills at the apple slingshots and of course enjoy the world famous Kilby Cream ice cream. A few favorite flavors emerged including Tractor Tracks and Ravenberry. We were very appreciative of the employees of Kilby Cream for braving the elements with us and taking such good care of us. The staff at Kilby's commented several times about the great behavior of our students and we are already working together to plan next year's

trip!

The PBIS team is already working to put the finishing touches on our second marking period trip which will be ice skating at the Fred Rust Arena on the campus of the University of Delaware. Tentative dates for the trip are as follows:

**February 14, 2013 grade 6**

**February 21, 2013 grade 7**

**February 28, 2013 grade 8**

At this time the cost for the trip is projected to be \$12.00/student, which includes lunch of 2 slices of pizza and soda; however, the price is subject to change depending on fuel cost at the time of the trip. We are looking forward to another great trip with the Green Zone students.

In addition to Green Zone, our students were recognized for being TRIPLE CROWN award winners. **The criteria for TRIPLE CROWN are as follows:**

0-1 Office Referrals for the marking period

Less than 1.5 days of absence

No grade below a C- on the report card.

Unlike Green Zone, the TRIPLE CROWN criteria "resets" each marking period, so a student can miss it the first one, but bounce back during each of the remaining marking periods. Again, we had good results the first marking period as 44.6 % of all students in PVMS qualifies as TRIPLE CROWN winners. Eighth grade had the most students, 100, while sixth finished with 81 and seventh added 71. These students were treated to popcorn and a movie to celebrate.



The last PBIS item to share good news about is FREDDIE'S CHALLENGE. Our new mascot, Freddie the Falcon along with Mr. Zimmerman and Mrs. Spangler, put out a challenge to our students at the beginning of the year. The challenge, be the grade level who was the fastest to have 30 days WITHOUT an office referral. This did not have to be 30 days in a row. Well, the sixth grade really outshined the other two groups in this challenge. On Friday, November 9th, the sixth grade earned their 30<sup>th</sup> sticker and became the winners of the first challenge. They are currently working to choose their prize! Will it be a new hairstyle for Mr. Zimmerman, a new wardrobe for Mrs. Spangler that includes Raven's purple or a combination of both? Stay tuned! The challenge has begun again and we will report in the next newsletter who is meeting Freddie's Challenge.
