

## Online Discussion Participation Rubric

Use this rubric to rate your online participation in our class. Please submit your self-assessment score on a weekly basis as noted in the Course Map and on the class wiki.

Score	Label	Description
0	Phantom	If you were online, we couldn't "see" you. (You did not post to the discussion.)
1	Pretender	You showed up a few times, but your postings did not add new insights or concepts to the discussion. You may have posted to many people, but your posts lack original thinking and do not advance the discussion. Examples of your postings: "I agree," "Well said." "You go, girl!"
2	Present	You posted at least <b>1</b> substantive, timely, reply to someone else's posting.
3	Participant	You contributed your <b>own original post</b> to the discussion and you posted at least <b>2</b> substantive, timely, replies to someone else's postings that contributed to the class discussion.
4	Participant +	You contributed your <b>own original post</b> to the discussion and you posted at least <b>3</b> substantive, timely, replies to someone else's postings that contributed to the class discussion.
5	Provocateur	You went beyond "Participant +" by initiating interaction with others on the discussion topic. Examples of these posts include additional relevant articles, materials, experiences, etc. that kick the discussion up a notch.
