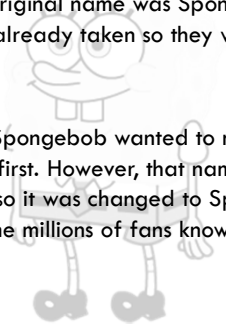
And in text citations

What is paraphrasing?

Putting the facts
you have gathered
into your own
words.

For example...

- "Spongebob's original name was Sponge boy, but that name was already taken so they went with Spongebob!"
- The creator of Spongebob wanted to name him Sponge boy at first. However, that name was already taken, so it was changed to Spongebob, which is the name millions of fans know and love today.



Things to consider:

- You may use TWO direct quotes per body paragraph.
 - Must be put in quotation marks.
- Must show HUGE difference
- VOICE!!!!
- Still need to be cited.

In text citations

- Comes after EVERY sentence
- Credit your source
- Goes INSIDE parenthesis
- Goes INSIDE the period

What is used to cite?

- Author's name
 - Last only
 - (Cortez)
 - Unless more than one author with same last name
 - (Cortez, Horatio)
 - (Cortez, Ernesto)
- Website name
 - (Nickelodeon.com)
- URL
 - (www.nickelodeon.com)

For Example

Spongebob Squarepants became a hit phenomenon from the first episode that aired. The first episode of Spongebob aired after The Kids Choice awards and continues to play today (Squidoo.com). It is the top rated show for audiences between the ages of two and eleven with nearly 61.4 million viewers watching the show every month (Aber). In fact, Spongebob has a high adult following, as well. Since the premier of the show, viewers over the age of 18 has increased by 76% (Aber).
