## Scenery Design

- Painting the flats to reflect the setting of the play
- Choosing set dressing to fit the setting and atmosphere and mood
- Choosing furniture and other set pieces to add to the atmosphere and setting

## Why is scenery necessary?

- To hide the backstage and wing areas of the stage
- To establish setting
- To create mood and atmosphere
- To make the play more real
- To provide an environment for the actors to perform in

## Process

- Step 1: Rough Draft Drawing
- Step 2: 3D Model
- Step 3: Measuring dimensions, gathering supplies
- Step 4: Building and Decorating
- Step 5: Placement on stage

## What makes up scenery?

- Painted Flats
  - Frames of wood covered with plywood or stretched canvas
- Set Pieces and Props
- Furniture
- Set Dressing
  - Any wall decorations
  - Foliage
  - Floor Coverings
