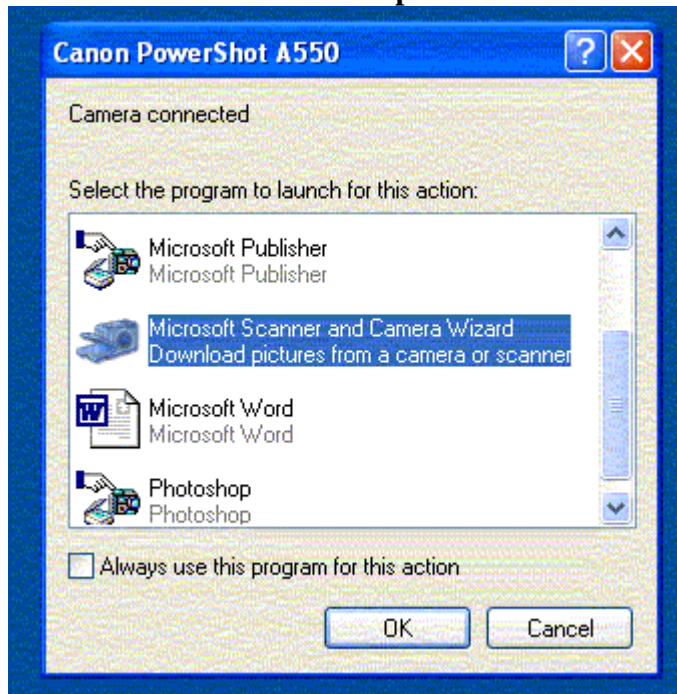
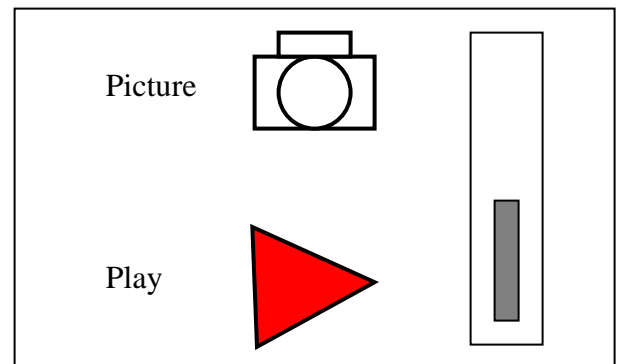


Downloading Pictures from a Digital Camera to a Computer (Windows XP)

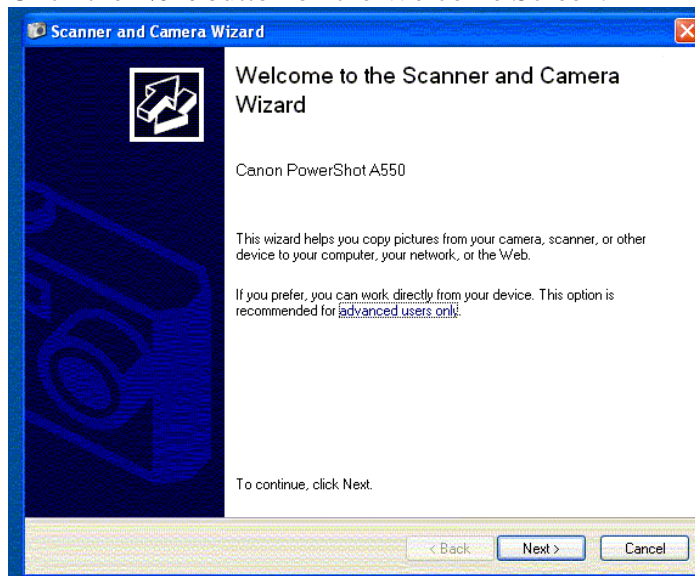
1. Plug the USB data cable that came with the camera into the AV/Out plug on the camera. Plug the other end of the cable into an open USB port on your computer, and turn the camera **ON**.
2. The following window will appear. Highlight the option that says **“Microsoft Scanner and Camera Wizard: Download pictures from a camera or Scanner”** and then click the **OK** button.



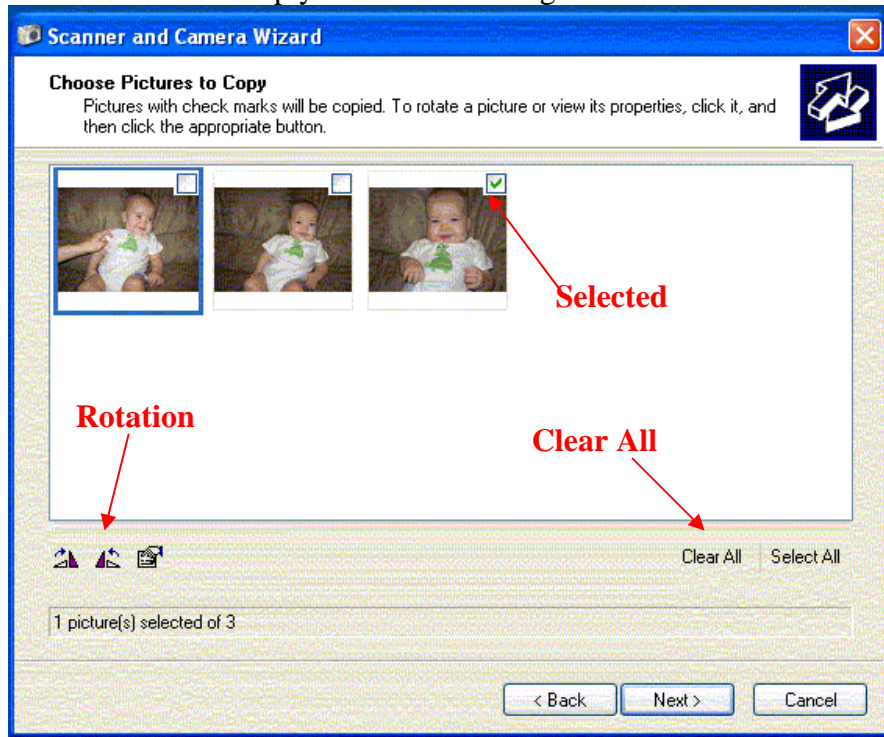
***If this window/wizard does not appear, the camera you are using may have a button on the back of it that needs to be switched from “Picture” mode [for taking pictures] to “Play” mode [for viewing pictures already taken].



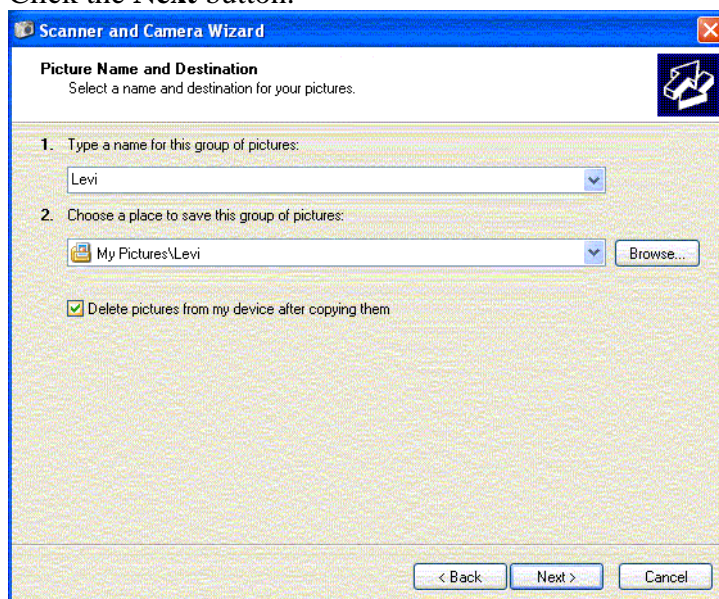
3. Click the **Next** button on the Welcome Screen.



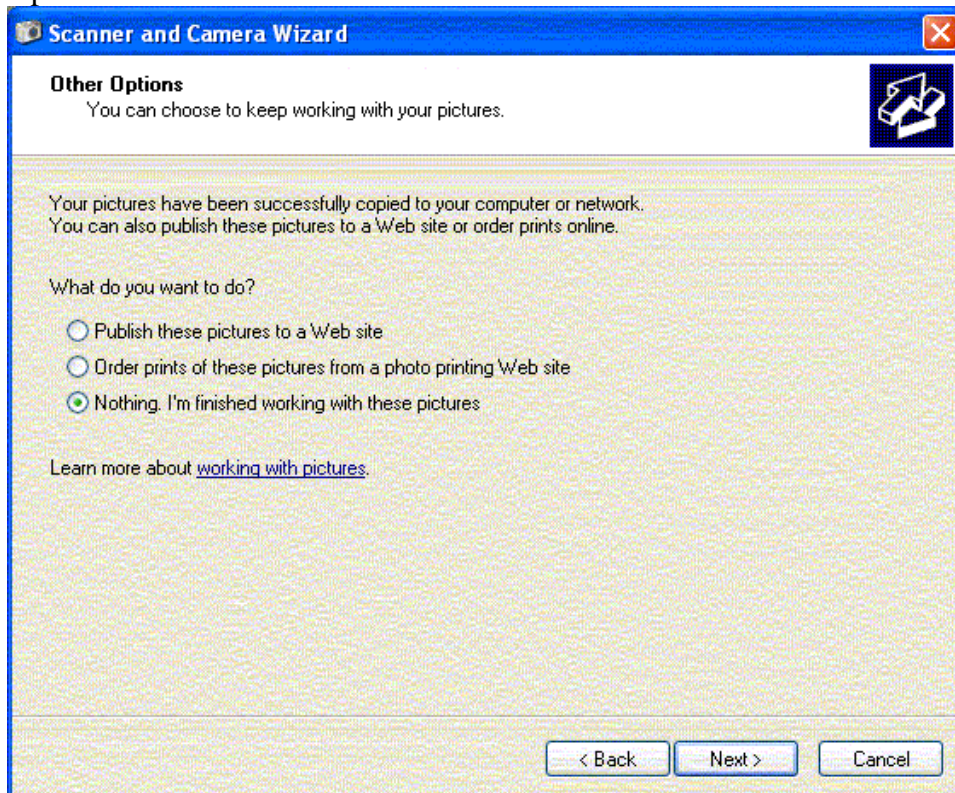
4. Put a checkmark next to the pictures that you want to download (Tip: If there are a lot of pictures on the camera and you only want a few, click the “Clear All” option and then check the ones you want). You can also rotate the pictures on this screen if you have any that are sideways using the buttons that have empty and colored triangles. Click the **Next** button.



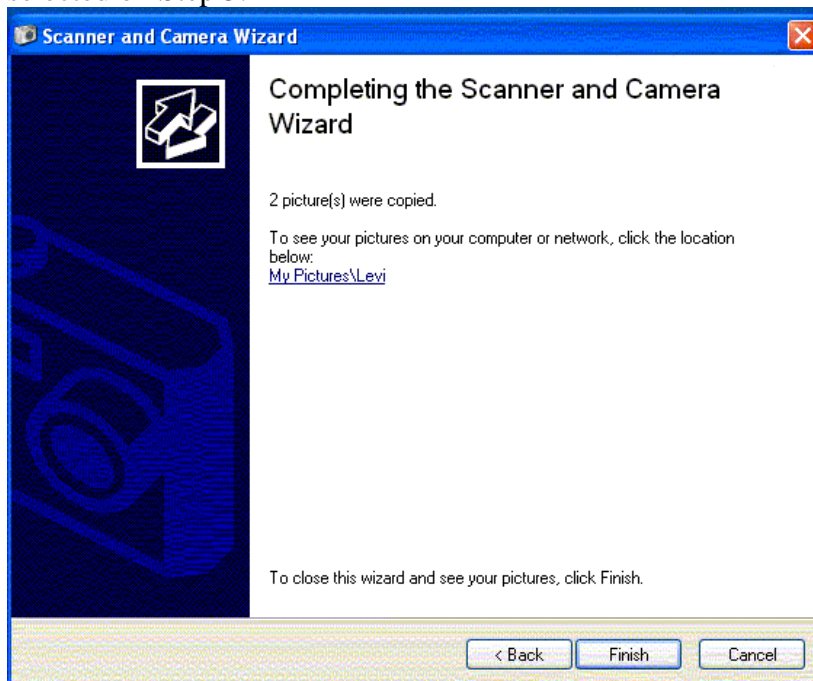
5. In the 1st field, type in a name for the group of pictures (I typed in “Levi” so the first picture downloaded will be automatically named “Levi 1”, the next “Levi 2”, and so on). In the 2nd field, click the **Browse** button to select a location to download your pictures to. Select the checkbox next to “Delete pictures from my device after copying them” (which will keep the memory card in the camera clean for the next user). Click the **Next** button.



6. Make sure that third option (“Nothing. I’m finished with these pictures”) is selected on the “Other Options” screen and click the **Next** button.



7. Click the **Finish** button on the last screen and your pictures will be downloaded to folder that you selected on Step 5.



8. Turn the camera **OFF** and disconnect the USB data cable from the computer and the camera (make sure you turn in the cable with the camera so the next user can download his/her pictures).
