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Study radio and broadcast your own shows in 2012

This program is designed to encourage young people to aim for tertiary education, through a practical course in radio. Participants will develop skills in communication, problem solving and critical thinking, initiative and enterprise, technology use and self-management. They will learn about study and work opportunities in Communications and Media and broadcast their own show on 5PBAFM in Salisbury. Twelve25 Salisbury Youth Enterprise Centre, the City of Salisbury's Youth Centre is providing support in kind to the program.

The Program is built on the Certificate II in Creative Industries (Media)

It is offered by Radio Adelaide Training in conjunction with 5PBA FM in Salisbury, as part of the University of Adelaide's Higher Education Participation and Partnerships Program (HEPPP).

When: Mondays at 4:30pm-6:30 pm. Classes will run across school terms 2, 3 and 4, starting on **Monday April 30th**.

Broadcast: Broadcast of the weekly hour long radio program will run in Terms 3 and 4.

Where: Classes will be taught at PBA-FM Community Radio and at the 12/25 Salisbury Youth Enterprise Centre's new computing facilities.

The **Certificate II in Creative Industries** comprises these 8 units.

Students must attend weekly workshops. Term 2 workshops will build the skills to begin broadcasts in term 3 and 4. Students will produce and deliver the hourly weekly radio program, broadcast on PBA-FM on Mondays at 6pm-7pm. The course itself will total approximately 72 hours (2 hours per week for 36 weeks), excluding the broadcast program.

Assessments will be continuous throughout the course. Methods may include presentations, written assignments, projects, research exercises, self assessment, on-the-job practical assessments, group exercises and on-line learning. The program is managed by industry leader Radio Adelaide, modelled on their successful delivery of Certificate II and III level courses in SA since 1998.

Learning Support:

The Certificate II program is to be taught and facilitated by Mateo Szlapek-Sewillo, a professional staff member of the HUMSS Faculty. Mateo has extensive tutoring and student support experience and will provide extra support as needed for students enrolled in the program. He also has substantial radio experience, having been a broadcaster at Radio Adelaide since 2009. He holds a Bachelor's Degree in Economics and an Honours Degree in International Studies, both from the University of Adelaide.

Entry requirements:

Candidates can enter with limited or no vocational experience and qualification.

Career prospects:

Possible roles in community or mainstream media. This qualification reflects the role of individuals who perform a range of mainly routine tasks in the creative industry sectors, work under direct supervision, and use limited practical skills and fundamental operational knowledge in a defined context. It can be used as a pathway into Certificate III level qualifications in related fields.
