What is a digital portfolio?

- ★ A collection of work samples completed by the student.
- ★ Student self evaluations.
- ★ Student reflections.
- ★ Multimedia evidence of student learning.
- ★ Online communication tool between home and school.

Why should students in my classroom have one?

- ★ Home / school communication tool.
- ★ Great way to showcase their learning achievements.
- ★ Opportunity to capture learning we often don't have effective or formal ways to do so.
- ★ An opportunity for student owned and operated work.
- ★ Teacher only provides the tasks, criteria and scaffold for the structure of the portfolio.

What should students include in a digital portfolio?

- ★ There are no rules as to what to include. However, as the teacher you need to provide a scaffold for the portfolio.

What should students include in a digital portfolio?

Some examples of what a digital portfolio could include:

- ★ A welcome page.
- ★ An about me page.
- ★ Major assessment tasks.
- ★ Student learning blog/journal, either written or spoken (daily or weekly)
- ★ Student goals.
- ★ Samples of reading/speaking & listening with student self evaluations.
- ★ Image galleries of learning experiences.
- ★ Curriculum content areas for student work.

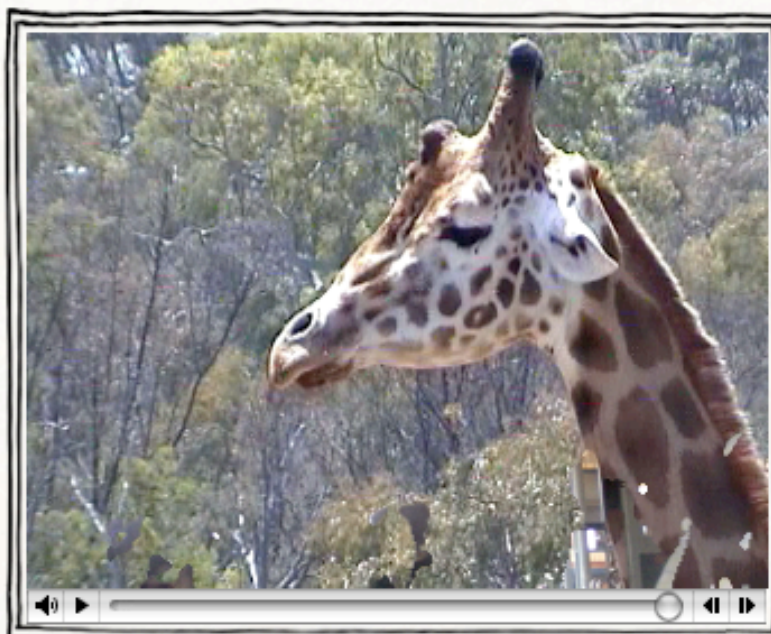

Creating a digital portfolio?

Take some photos in Photo Booth and a short video.

- ★ Open iWeb and look at all the different templates. Choose one.
- ★ Look at the pages and we choose a "Welcome" page.
- ★ Change the headings and the text by double clicking,
- ★ Click on "MEDIA" and choose photos. When you drag out a photo onto the photos that were already there it replaces them.
- ★ Next, make a movie page and drag our movie onto the movie place holder. Change the text.
- ★ Make a blog page and add some entries.
- ★ Make an albums page to drag a group of photos (events or albums) to.
- ★ Use iSight Photo and iSight Movie to add content.
- ★ Go to Pages and create a document and put it into iWeb using Share - Share to iWeb.
