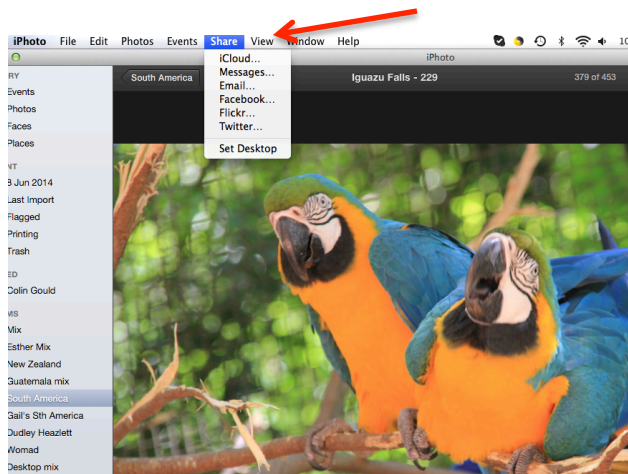


RESIZING PHOTOS TO SEND AS EMAIL – iMacs and MacBooks

Modern digital cameras take photos of incredible resolution – 10mbs per photo is not uncommon, but they are still a problem sending as email as many servers won't allow documents of that size and ... the bigger the mbs the slower they take to send and download at the other end. If you just want to send a picture without requiring the full resolution and size then use these tips.

1. Sending photos directly from iPhoto

1. Select the photo and go to Share

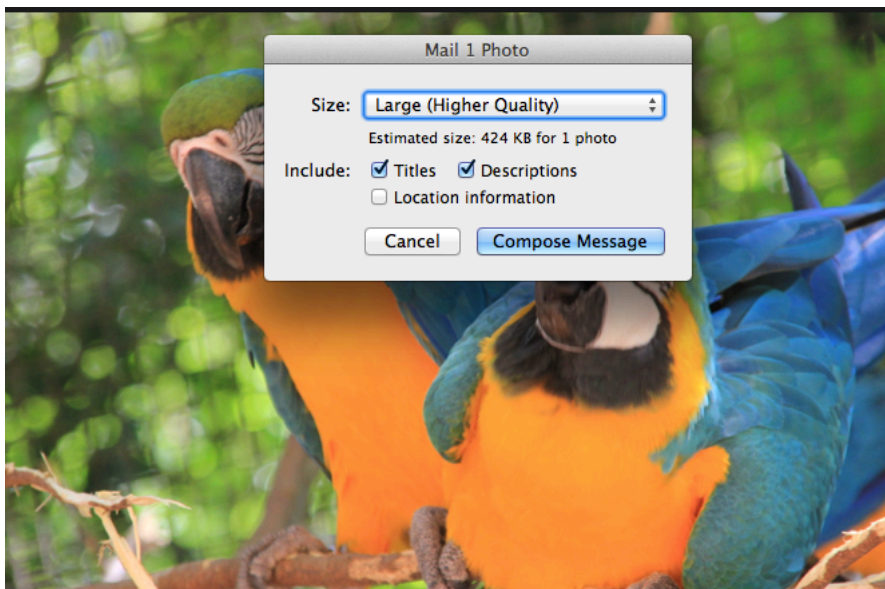


Select Email

The window below will appear.

If you click on the Size window it will give you the choices -

- Small (Faster Downloading)
- Medium
- ✓ Large (Higher Quality)
- Actual Size (Full Quality)

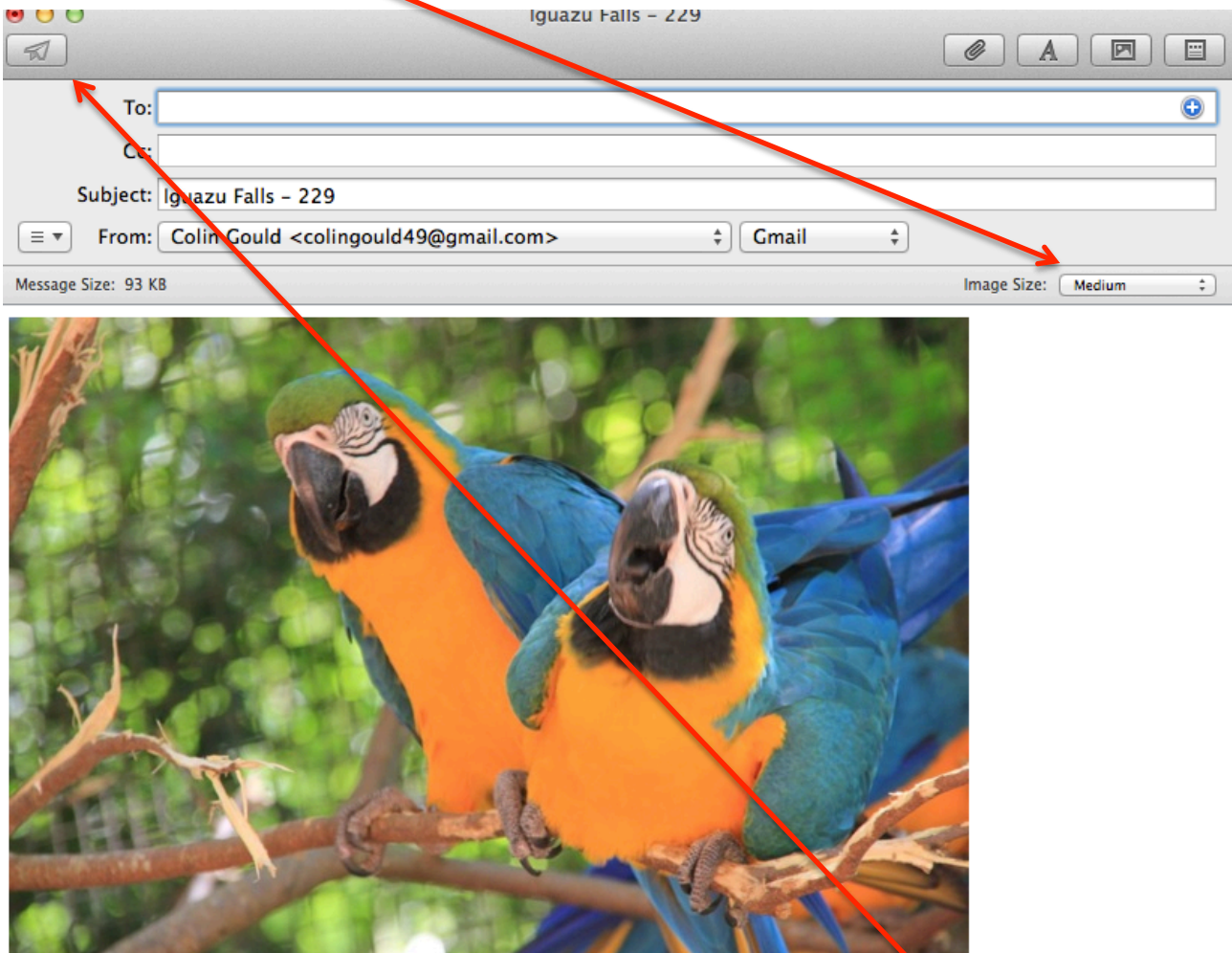


When selected it shows the estimated size – for example.. this photo in Actual Size is 6.3mb but in Small (Faster Downloading) it is only 65kb – the photo is also quite small.

I generally choose the Large (Higher Quality) which is of good size but manageable “bulk”

Then click Compose Message

Compose Message will open your mail program with the photo attached. You can still change the size of the photo here by selecting ***Image Size***
