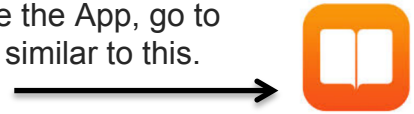


Exploring iBooks

For today's exercise we are going to look at some of the features in iBooks which maybe of interest to you.,

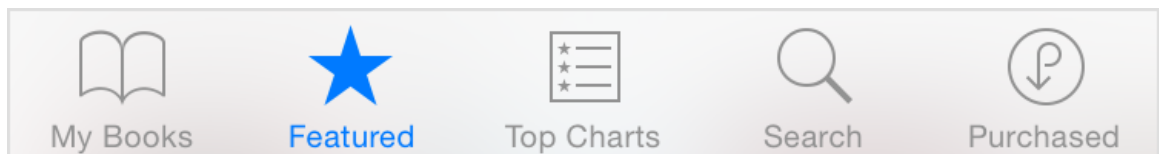
Open your iBooks icon. If for some reason you don't have the App, go to App Store and download it. The icon will look like a book similar to this.



Now you are ready to explore what this App can offer.

You can access the iBooks Store by using one of the methods below:

- On later models of the iPad with you can access the iBooks Store with the icon the bottom of the iBooks screen.



- On earlier Ipad when you open iBooks and tap the Store button.
- On computers with OS X Mavericks or later, open iBooks and click the iBooks Store button.

The number of books you can have in iBooks depends on the space available on your device. iBooks doesn't limit the number of books in your library.

EXERCISE 1

Searching for and downloading a *Free Thriller*.

When you click on the Featured Icon  it will show many of the of the latest books feature in. Tale time and explore what is on offer

If you wish to search for a particular book go the search icon a type in the name of a book you may like to read.

- In the *Search* area type in Free Thrillers and see what comes up.
- Select a thriller you think you may enjoy. Tap on GET
- Type in your APPLE ID and the boom will down load to your library
- Tap on the bottom of your screen My Books and the free book will appear there.
- Open your book and begin to explore the options in the right hand top corner for reading a book.
- Take time to investigate what the line at the bottom of your screen does.
- Have a go at download a free book in a category you are interested in

Finally, if you want to delete a book simply tap Select in the right hand corner and delete.

EXERCISE 2

Saving and Storing a PDF document in iBOOKs

- Open your Browser and type in *mind games for the aging brain pdf*
- Tap just above the article and below the menu bar and it will say “open in iBooks”
- Tap
- The article will now appear in your iBooks library under PDFs
- Open the article and explore
