



Editing Your Photos



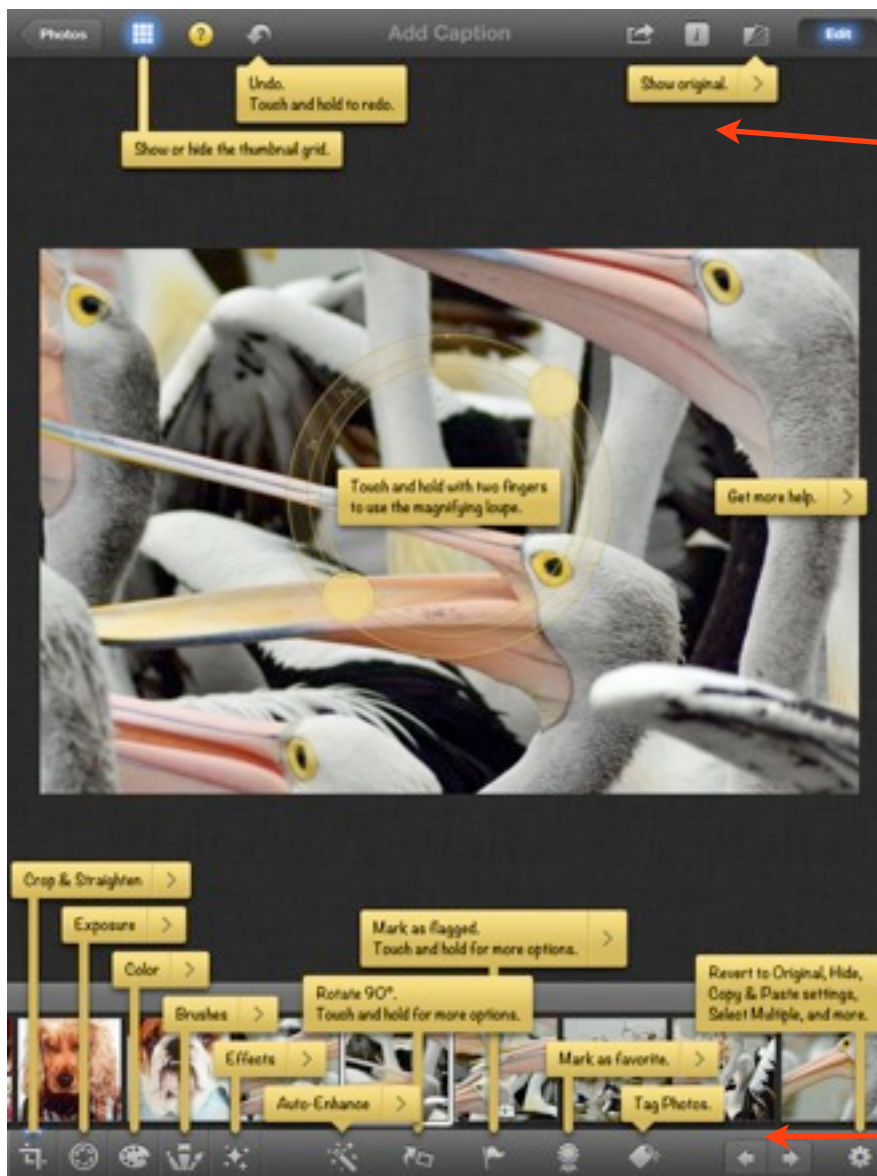
iPhoto (Cost \$5.49)

iPhoto is Apple's own editing app. All photos on your camera roll and Photos app will be visible.

This app allows more sophisticated and detailed photo editing than the Photos app.

Editing your photos.

- Select a photo by tapping on it, the album it is in or event. You can change your selection by scrolling through the thumbnails below.



- Use the tools at the top to adjust view, undo, share or show original photo.

- Use the tools at the bottom of the page to edit your photo.



Albums: Albums you upload using Photo Stream, *create using the Photos app*, or sync from your computer using iTunes.

Photos: All the photos you take with, import to, or beam to your device

Events: Events you sync to your device from your computer using iTunes, or import from a digital camera or memory card.

Journals: The Journals you create using iPhoto.

Creating a Journal

- Open an album or event.
- Click the share tool.....Journal.....choose the photos you want for your first page.
- Select 'Create Journal'.....Show.
- Select edit to choose from a variety of options to personalise your journal.
- Under the cog icon you can choose a theme for your journal and layout -
- Click on a photo once to add a caption
- Use two fingers to resize images
- The cog icon allows you to choose borders, grid size and layout for your page
- The + icon allows you to add a variety of items (widgets) to the page:

Headers, Text, Notes, New Page, Quotes, Memory, Space, Divider, Map, Date, Weather

- To relocate your images or files press, hold and drag to the desired location.

• Once you're happy with how your Journal looks, leave Edit mode by tapping on the Edit button again. Tap the sharing icon, then iCloud. Your Journal will be compiled and you'll be given a link which you can send to family and friends.

Use your iPad to get creative...

• Different sizes

Ensuring your photos are all different sizes makes for a far more interesting photo journal. It's also worth knowing that tapping on any photo will display it in full-screen mode for more detailed viewing

• Widgets everywhere

There are eleven different page elements that you can add to your journal to make it interesting. A solid combination of text and images should elevate it way beyond a simple photo album

• Sunny side

It might not be a birthday, but it's a sunny, warm day up well in photo worth flagging a weather widget

• Knowledge

Journal comp
When you export finished Journal you'll be given a link which you can share with family and friends that they can view favourite memories. Your exported Journal as iPhoto may be completely web-based or it'll run in respect of the device you're using
