



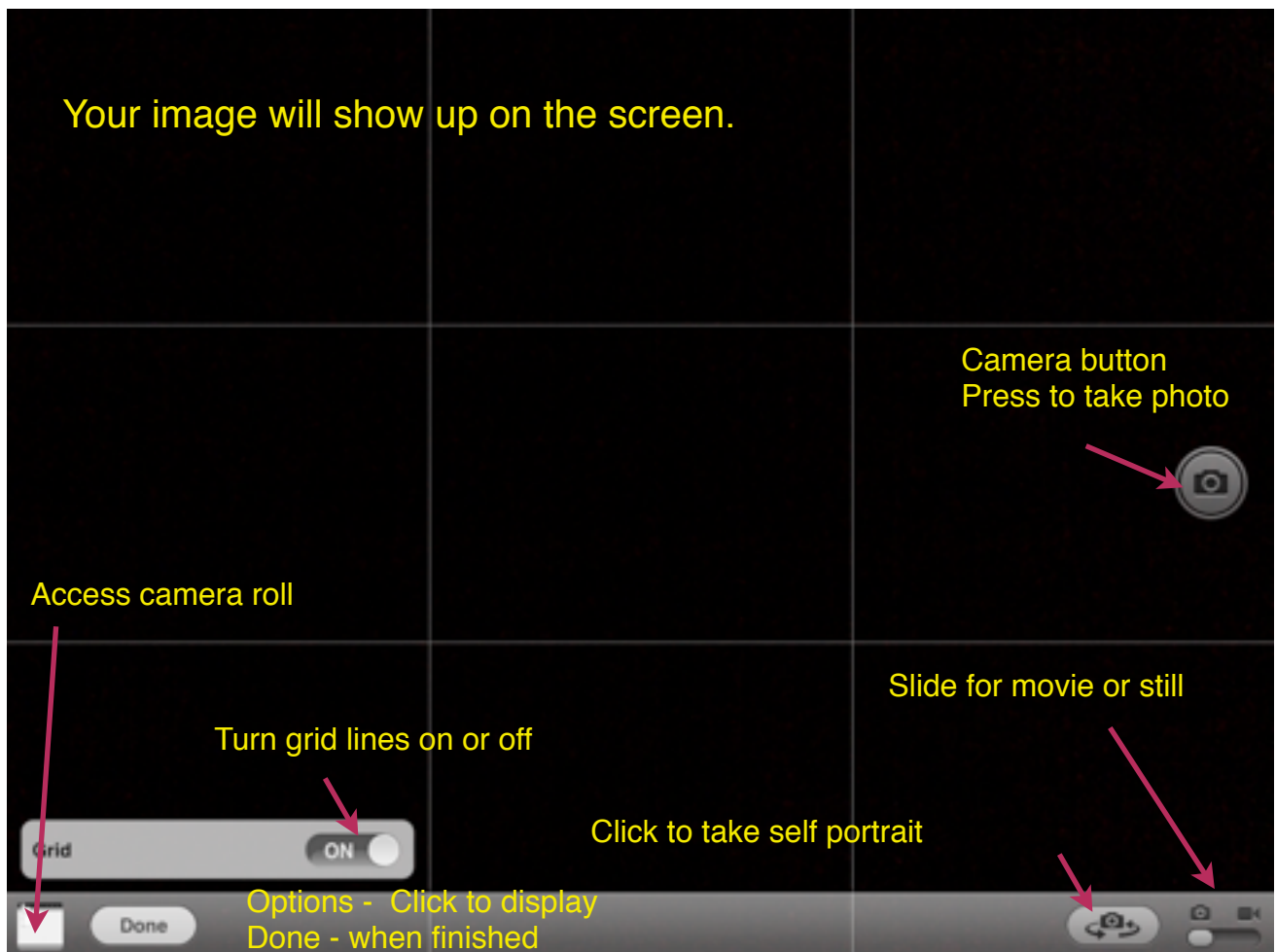
Mac Users Group - iPad tips and tricks



Taking photos on your iPad.

Open the camera app. You have a number of choices:

1. Take a photo of an object or person.
2. Take a photo of yourself
3. Take a video of 1. or 2.
4. View the shot you have taken and decide whether to keep or discard it.





Photos

The 'Photos' app is where you will collect, organise and make use of your photos. As you download future photography apps they will ask to access your photos from here. Let's work our way through the basics.

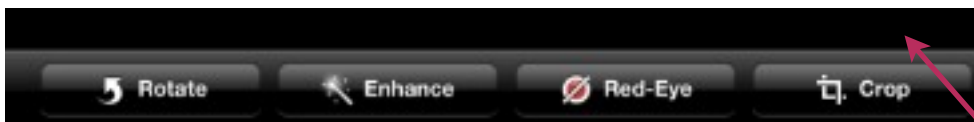
When you open the 'Photos' app you will see all the photos you have taken on your iPad, imported from iPhoto or imported from your camera.



Click on a photo to enlarge it. You have a few options from here:

Edit

- You can do some basic editing from here. For better editing tools there is a range of free and paid apps you can download.
- Click edit. At the bottom of the page you will see some basic tools. If you are happy with the changes you make press the save button at the top of the page. You can also Cancel; Undo or Revert to Original.



Rotate - As it suggests

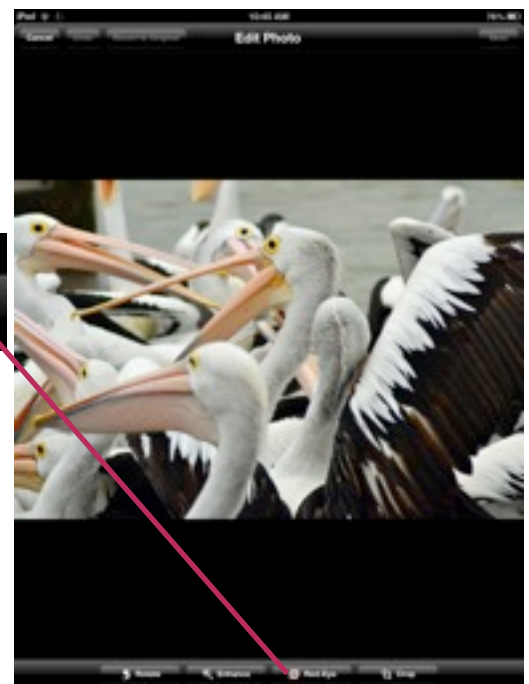
Enhance - Automatically enhances colour, brightness and contrast

Red-eye - tap eyes to cover red-eye.

Crop - allows you to get rid of unwanted background, etc. Drag the edges to create the desired image.

Slideshow

- Your photo library will be displayed for you. Select the type of transition you want, what music you want from your music library.





Share (The arrow)

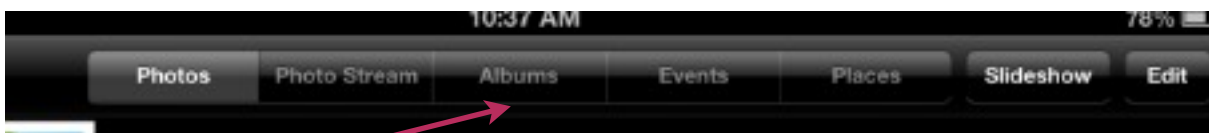
- This allows you to share your photo in a variety of ways - eg email, Message. We will go into these later.

Trash

- Delete the photo.

To return to your photo library click 'Photos'. You can also slide your way through the images once enlarge to view them individually at your own pace.

At the top of the page you will see these headings:



Albums

You will often want to organise your photos so they are easier to find. Albums provides the easiest option for this. These albums you create transfer to other apps such as iPhoto.

- To create an album Click the + sign in the top left hand corner. You will be asked to name the album.
- Simply click on the desired photos you wish to place in the album. A tick will appear on selected photos. When you have finished your selection click 'Done'. The new album will appear.
- To add more photos at a later date, open the album, click edit, add photos and select the additional photos as before.
- To delete an album click edit on the album page. Touch the cross on the album you wish to delete and confirm when asked. The photos will remain on the camera roll until you delete them.

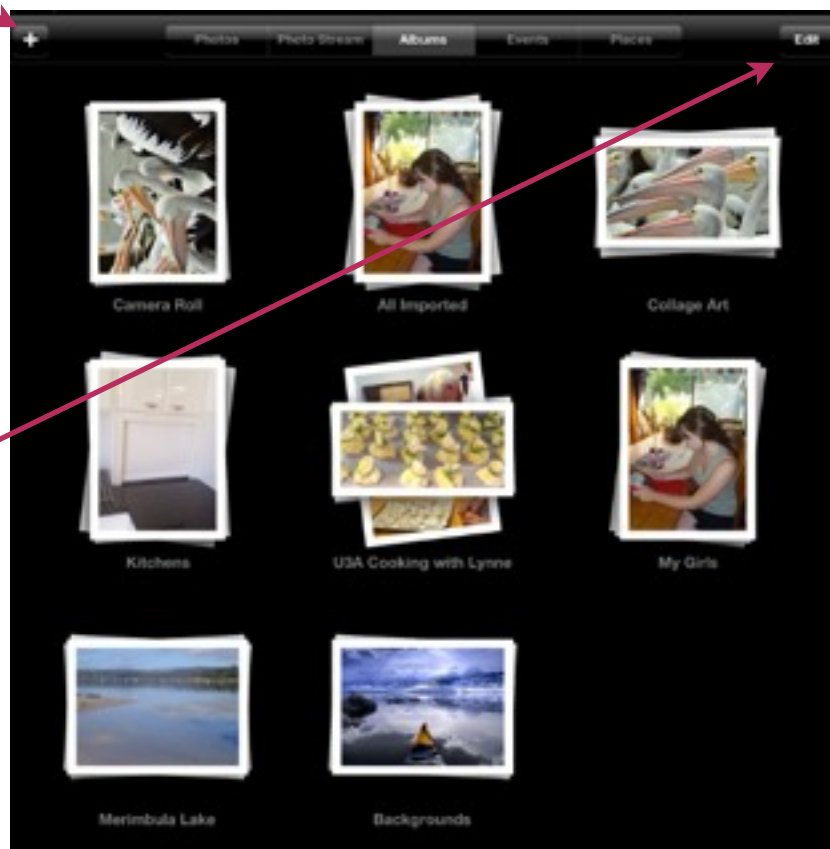




Photo Stream

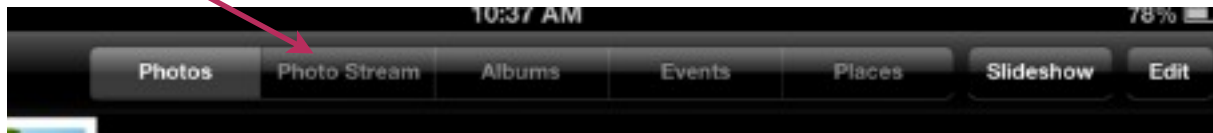


Photo Stream is a handy tool for sharing photos between your Mac, iPhone and iPad. It can also be used to share photos with another user of these devices.



You will need to have an iCloud account in settings. The first thing you need to do is turn on Photo Streaming on your device/s.

- Go to settings.....Photos & Camera.....My PhotoStream - ON, Shared

Photo Stream - ON for iPad and iPhone

- Open iPhoto on your Mac. Find Photo Stream in the left hand menu

- Turn on Photo Stream.

You can turn off Photo Stream at any time.

As you take a **new** photo on any of these devices it will automatically be added to each device.

You can also transfer old photos to your other devices.

- Go to your Photos page in 'Photos'.
- Select Edit. Tap the photos you want to transfer
- Select 'Share'....Choose 'Photo Stream'



- Select **new** Photo Stream.....Type in your email address.....Name the Album.....Next OR select an album you have previously created and select 'Post'.

You can also send photos to other Mac Users with iCloud accounts. Follow the same process as above and type in the users email address. Again, once the initial album is set up you can add to it by posting photos to it.

'Photos' provides you with very basic editing capabilities. If you want to do more with your photos or have a bit of fun there are unlimited apps available to you for a variety of purposes, both paid and free.

Below are just a few to get you started. These will be explored over the next few weeks. Go to the app store and see what you can find.
