



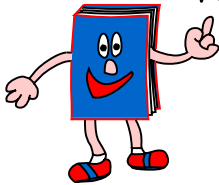
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Lesson: Subject and Verb

Underline the subject once and the verb twice in the following:



Note: Every sentence contains a subject and a verb. The subject is the word or group of words that answers the question 'who?' or 'what?' before the verb. The verb tells what the subject does, what is done to the subject, or the condition of the subject.

Example: The car hit the tree.

'car' is the subject and 'hit' is the verb
