Self-Directed Search developed by Dr. John Holland

- Used by over 22 million people worldwide, been translated into 25 different languages
- Results have been supported by over 500 research studies
- Categorizes with respect to six types: Realistic, Investigative, Artistic, Social, Enterprising, and Conventional

Careers for Me (published by *Career Kids, LLC*)

- Grades K-3, 3-7, 6-9
- For Severely Handicapped Special Needs Students

O*NET Career Interests Inventory (self-directed career exploration assessment)

College Survival and Success Scale

Measures a student's ability to get the most from postsecondary education and training and use it to build a successful future.

Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB)

- Provided by The U.S. Department of Defense (DoD)
- Given to high school and post-secondary school students since 1968

Strong Interest Inventory

Used to match student's interests to professional careers and also indicates preferred work style, learning environment and leadership style.

Keirsey Temperament Sorter

Helps to discover temperament type: Artisan, Guardian, Rational or Idealist

Myers-Briggs (MBTI)

Top rated instrument to help assess personality type and explore career options

SIGI Plus (System of Interactive Guidance and Information)

Discover

- Provided by ACT
- comprehensive career planning program, multiple delivery options

Career Connections Jr. (CDROM software)

- Grades 5–9 or special-needs students
- "edutainment" software that helps students explore more than 260 jobs

Campbell Interest and Skill Survey (CISS) published by Pearson

Measures self-reported vocational interests and skills

Career Exploration Inventory (CEI) published by JIST Works

Helps to explore and plan three major areas of life—work, leisure activities, and learning
