


# Outline for Written Report

- I. Introduction of the god or goddess
  - A. State the name of the god or goddess.
  - B. Explain what the god or goddess ruled or had power over. Name any special power the god or goddess had. Explain what that character's role was in the world of Greek mythology.
  - C. Tell who your god, goddess, or mythological character is related to (such as brother/sister to Zeus, son of Zeus, etc.) This is the family tree.
  - D. Tell about any symbol that is associated with the god or goddess. Remember, heroes and other characters will not have a symbol.
- II. Famous stories about the god or goddess
  - A. State the name of the myth that you read.
  - B. Retell this myth in your own words briefly but completely. This is the summary. You may read more than one myth associated with your god or goddess. If you do, you will use a letter "C" to write the name of the second myth you read and a letter "D" to write the summary of the myth.
- III. Explanation of how this god, goddess, or research topic relates to our world today.
  - A. Is the goodness, honor, and or power of this god, goddess, or topic still admired and held in high respect today? Give examples.
  - B. What scientific phenomenon was explained through the god's or goddess' power? How do we explain this phenomenon today? Are there similarities/differences between the Greek's belief on this matter and our present day belief? (example: Olympic Games)
  - C. Is there a planet, constellation, company, animal, etc. named for this character? Explain.
  - D. Are there any words or expressions that we get from this god/goddess or the myth surrounding this character? Explain.

\*\*\*\*Note: Outlining only has to be done in phrases, not in complete sentences.

## Microsoft Word Outlining Tips

1. Use the Format menu—Bullets and Numbering. Select the Numbered tab, NOT Outline Numbered.
2. Use these icons  on the tool bar to move to the right (down a level) or to the left (up a level) in your outline.
3. Holding down the shift key and pressing enter will allow you to get a new line without getting a new letter or number.
4. Line spacing can be quickly obtained with the following keyboard shortcuts:
  - a. Ctrl + 1 = single
  - b. Ctrl + 2 = double
  - c. Ctrl + 5 = 1.5
