

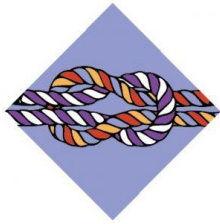

Dear Cub Parents and Guardians,



In order to keep Cubbing relative; active and fun in our Region; we have decided to continue with some of our activities online.

Every year the Cubs participate in a National Challenge. Completion of various activities ensures that they earn a National badge for their efforts.

The activities for the badge are based on the Worldwide Sustainable Development goals (SDG's). The SDG's for this year are Gender equality (5), Climate action (13), Life below water (14) and Life on land (15). We will be focusing on elements of the National Challenge that can be completed and signed off at home.

From you we require that you support your Cub in completing these activities through active discussions (around the dinner table perhaps) and setting some time aside to aid with physical activities. We request that you compile a National Challenge file in which written activities, drawings and perhaps photo evidence of tasks are kept.

These will be collected when we return to onsite Pack programmes. You will also be provided with a 'sign off' sheet.

Complete number 1 and one of the other tasks:

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| 1 | Explain why respect for others is important. Cubs can either explain/ discuss this with a parent or guardian or write a short paragraph on what respect is. |
| 2 | List ten occupations that are typically considered gender specific and give reasons why. Discuss if there are any reasons why the other gender could not have that occupation. |
| 3 | List three different culture groups found in South Africa, other than your own. Choose one group and share something interesting about the group and its members with your parent or guardian. |

connect

Complete one of the following tasks:

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| 1 | Using any of the following, take part in two activities to increase your awareness of physical challenges: wheelchair; blindfold; crutches; ear plugs; hands (one or two) held behind your back. |
| 2 | Interview a member of your family and find out something unique about them. Share your findings with your Pack. |
| 3 | Ask a member of your family how different cultures communicate and why it is a challenge. Share your findings with a friend or another Cub via WhatsApp. |

Complete one of the following tasks:

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| 1 | Make a snack or decorative object from a different South African culture. |
| 2 | Think about a community service project you have participated in. List some of the benefits of the project to the local community. |
