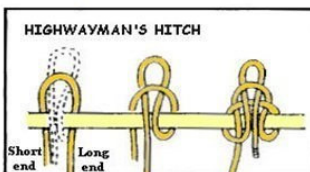
Troop Program - GUEST NIGHT

A special Troop program with the Cub Pack as guests

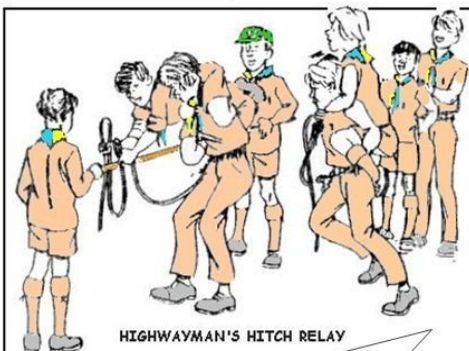

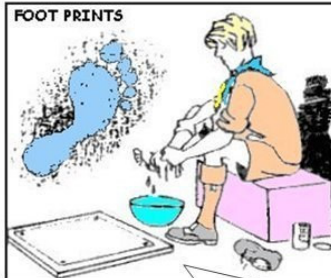


HIGHWAYMAN'S HITCH
Each Scout makes sure that (he/she also knows) his/her guest can make or tie a Highwayman's Hitch at speed.



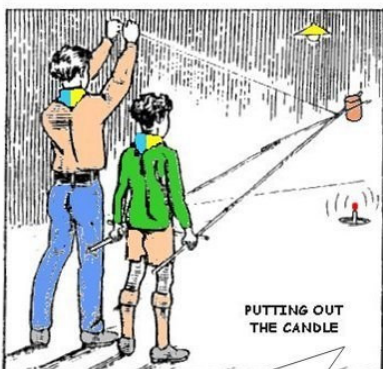
HIGHWAYMAN'S HITCH RELAY

One end of the rope is tied around the 'horse's' waist with a Bowline. The other end is held by the rider. Teams compete in Patrols (Scouters hold or tie staves). The riders make fast to the hitching rail with a Highwayman's Hitch before dismounting. They must then dive under the rail and run to touch the wall / bench, before remounting, releasing the horse and riding back.



FOOT PRINTS
Cubs wet the soles of their right foot (or hand) in water with food colouring added, then walk naturally (or make a hand imprint) over a sheet of white paper pinned to a smooth board. Outline the print with a pencil. Then add name, date and compare souvenir prints.

All are blindfolded and stand in silence on one spot for what they **think** is exactly 1 minute, then sit. A timekeeper keeps score.



PUTTING OUT THE CANDLE

Using canes, elastic bands, string and an empty tin. Teams to extinguish candle from base line without upsetting it. Alternate - light candle.



A MOMENT TO REMEMBER

A quiet moment reflecting on Law and Promise and finally a fire/s is lit with a 'sausage sizzle' while Cubs and Scouts talk around the fire/s. Then tidy up, flags and end with prayer by one of the guests. Thank all the guests for coming - give footprints to Cubs.

SCaR

SCaR, the little bulletin for CUBS, SCOUTS and ROVERS, signifying that a Group is made up of 3 youth branches (the other 2 being Scouters and Committee - the adult branches). A great shame in this huge Group tree, is that the Scout branch seems to be the only branch all green, lush and well taken care of by the Troop Scouters and Committee members. The other 2 branches do not seem to matter or seem far less important, a huge mistake made by adults (Refer to SCaR 14 page 2 about the Mowgli's on these pages). For starters, the Cub Pack and its Scouters are the 'gold' of the Group, the very heart from which future Scouts, Rovers and Scouters are born. Show me a Troop that has actually survived for any length of time without a Cub Pack feeding and growing it. Scouting is continual Scouter and Citizenship training in motion, from Pack to Troop to Rover and Scouter, a crucial cycle in producing dedicated adults, starting right from grass roots. Look after your Cubs, support them, invite them to Troop meetings and outings - a happy Cub eventually becomes a happy Scout on the path through our great Scout Movement.
