### A fun filled weekend away by Jeannie van Wulven

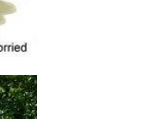
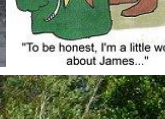
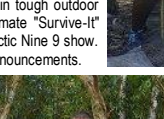
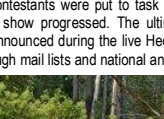
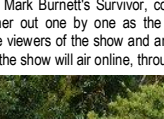
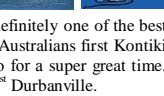
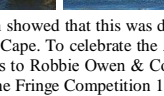
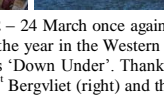
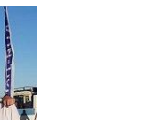

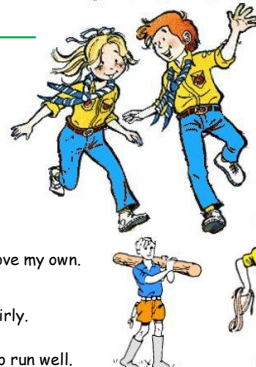
### THE PATROL LEADER'S CODE
