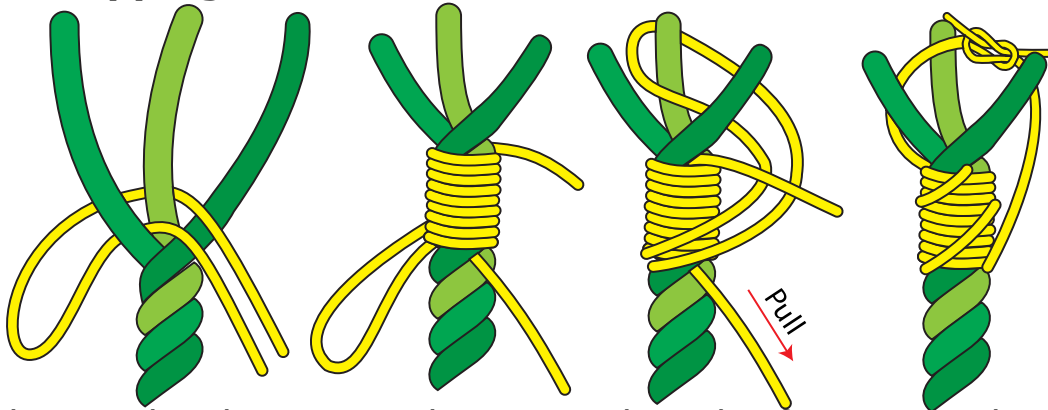


WHIPPING

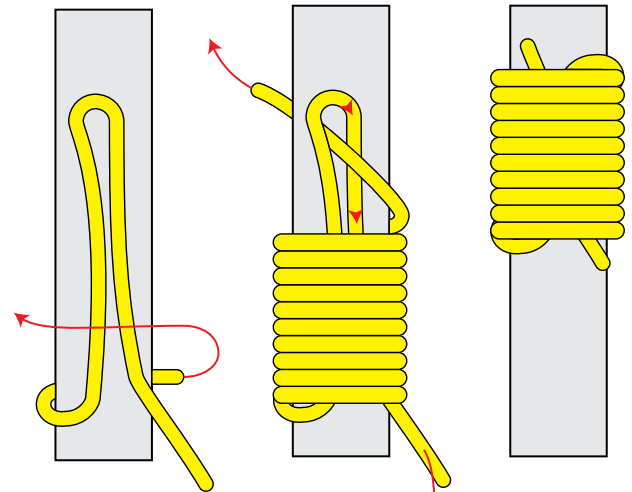
Sailmaker's Whipping:



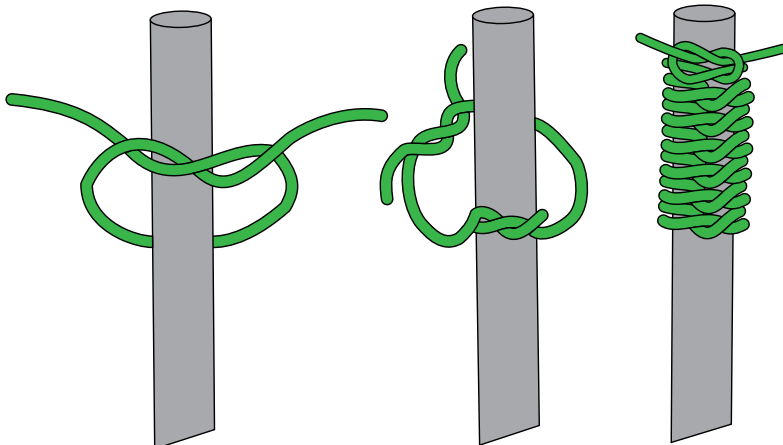
Start by unlaying the three strands. Loop a length of twine as shown in Fig 1. Relay the rope. Wind the long end of the twine tightly as in Fig 2. Lift the loop and take it over the same strand around which it is looped. Pull the other end as in Fig 3. Finish with a reef knot between the three strands. Cut ends and neaten ends of strands in Fig 4.

Simple Whipping:

Start with a loop of twine laid along the rope. Next proceed to bind a series of turns around the rope (1). Thread the end of the twine through the loop (2). Finally, pull the other end of the twine so that a lock is formed within the binding (3). Cut off the loose ends.



West Country Whipping:



Start by making a bight of twine around the rope. Tie a simple thumb knot and pull tight. Do the same at the back of the rope. Continue upwards pulling the twine tight. Finish with a reef knot.
