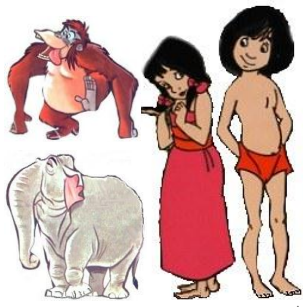
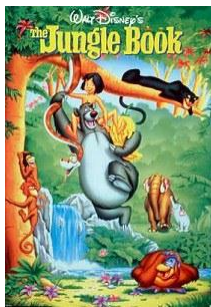

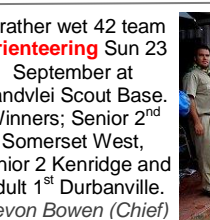

*"That's one small step for man, one giant leap for mankind".*

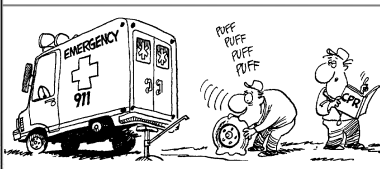

## 2015 WS Jamboree Japan - PROGRAM



Hiroshima Peace Memorial Park is erected near ground zero of the historical WW II Atomic bomb on Japan. 'Little Boy' was dropped on Hiroshima on Mon morning 6 Aug 1945 and 'Fat Man' followed on Thur 9 Aug on Nagasaki, between the two bombs, over 240 000 people were simply vaporized. The 'Atomic Dome' remarkably stayed standing after the blast and today forms part of the Park. A flame remains burning there in remembrance and as long as nuclear weapons are still produced.

**The Jamboree Program** at Kirara-hama will include **Peace** – a one day off site visit to the [Hiroshima Peace Memorial Park](#) and museum, the site of the Hiroshima atomic bomb explosion of 6 August 1945. This will also be the 70<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the bombing of cities in Japan, and 1 from each country will attend the Memorial Ceremony. **GDV** (Global Development Village) will be onsite raising awareness of global issues such as peace, the environment, development, human rights, health and disaster mitigation.



**Exploring Nature** to foster awareness will be a full day spent in Yamaguchi City. **CRC** (Cross Road of Culture) will promote the exchange of cultures among participants and an understanding of Japan. **COS** (City of Science) a day program in Kirara-hama opening an understanding of science and technology, the benefits and problems, including developing fuel cells, energy sources, robotics and automotive technologies. **Community Services** will be a day of comparing and 'reaching out' in the local community, experiencing real Japan in working with the locals.



**Water Activities** such as sailing, wind surfing, snorkelling, rafting and fishing will be carried

out at lakes, rivers or the nearby coast. **JJJ** (Join-in-Jamboree) will make use of high technology and networking to connect all youth (not only Scouts) around the world during the Jamboree, who cannot attend, but who will benefit from the program.



**Welcome the World Project** is building friendships with Scouts around the world, and has started already in Japan, to connect Scouts via Internet, letters and or even visiting each other. **Home Hospitality** will be available before and after the Jamboree to help increase understanding of the Japanese way of life, culture and cultivate mutual understanding. Solidarity Program **'Operation Kirara'** from the Jamboree site name, is a



separate program to give opportunities to Scouts in need of financial assistance to attend the Jamboree. **Work as Staff**, which is not open yet, will be open to all to apply via [this page](#), to come along and assist as staff on the Jamboree. **SAJ** (Scout Association of Japan) welcomes the world to the 23<sup>rd</sup> WSJ (World Scout Jamboree) in 2015, and would like as many countries represented as possible at this historical event.

SA's premiere sailing regatta the **Lipton Cup Challenge** was held Sat 18 to Fri 24 August in False Bay. This involved 25 L26's (an L26 is a 26 foot long keelboat) and crews from around the country. The Cup was first sailed in 1911 and the winner's then host the next regatta. In 2011 a team from False Bay Yacht Club won the Cup, thus this year it was held in the waters of False Bay. This year a young team from Royal Natal Yacht Club won, meaning 2013 will now be sailed in Durban.

In September last year I had the idea to enter a Scout team in this year's Cup. I believe that Scouting had provided us with sailing skills. Many told me I was mad and that it would take a lot of money and dedication to get a boat and crew in racing condition. Well after many weekends of hard work we fixed the boat, found a team manager and started training. 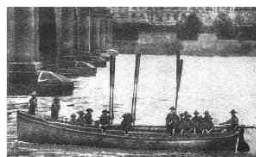

### Did you know?

100 years ago on Sat 4 August 1912, there was a Sea Scout tragedy that wrenched at the hearts of all in England, so much so that over a million people attended the funeral. The freak accident happened 2 miles off Leysdown, when a 25 foot cutter (sail and row boat) with 24 Scouts and 5 adults from 2<sup>nd</sup> Walworth Troop, was blown over in a sudden wind gust, sending all overboard into the icy water. 9 Boys lost their lives which is today known as **'The Leysdown Tragedy'**, with services held in their memory on Sat 4 August 2012 at the Leysdown Memorial and Nunhead Cemetery, where all the boys are buried. Thanks to the sterling work of FONC (Friends of Nunhead Cemetery) and Rex Batten (book author on the tragedy), their memory remains alive. ### 'Hot Tip' on Trailer Reversing



Ever wondered how on earth to reverse with a trailer or caravan or boat behind your car or truck? It's ever so simple. Do it slowly, your eyes glued to the very back tail of the trailer. If it goes left, you turn slowly left to bring it back into line. If it goes right, you turn slowly right to bring it back into line. You can either do it turned around in your seat looking back or using your rear view mirrors only. The trick is to imagine the trailer tail now steering you. Try it, once you see how easy it is, you'll only want to reverse! Now try turning and parking the trailer by reversing, applying the same principle. If something goes wrong, pull forward slightly and simply start again. Remember, ...turn the steering wheel slowly to correct, and ...ride slowly!

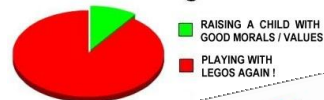
