

week 59: "buzz lightyear"

With his family moving away one week before his birthday, Andy Davis is given a week early party to spend with his friends, while his toys stage a reconnaissance mission to discover Andy's new presents! ¹

Games:

1. **Steam Release:** Woody and his friends?

(Woody is preparing to go on a cowboy camp with Andy but his right arm is accidentally torn. Andy decides to leave him at home. That's okay as he has lots of friends.)

Woody's friend's names are written on slips of paper, which are hidden around the playing area. Each Cub is given the name of a friend. On 'go' the Cubs need to go and look for their friend.

(Friend's names: Wheezer; Hamm; Mr Potato Head; Slinky Dog; Rex)

2. **Relay:** Car Race

(On an outing to the Pizza Planet, Buzz and Woody are arguing so much they fall out of the van.)

Sixes stand in teams and are numbered. Each number is given the name of a car. When the number or name of the car is called out, they have to race to the end of the playing area and back to their place, using the method they have been told, e.g.

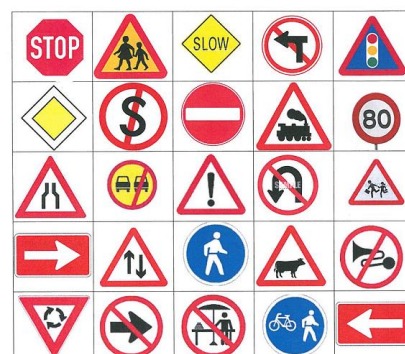
- Mini crawl
- VW hop
- Jaguar run
- Ford pigeon steps
- Toyota skip
- Truck walk side-ways

3. **Revision:** Road Sign Bingo

(Woody spots a Pizza Planet delivery truck and convinces him to give them a lift. Off they go; up and down many roads, past many traffic signs!)

Cubs are given a Bingo card each. Make up different cards so that there is a variety. Road signs are then called out and explained.

4. **Quiet:** Road Sign Jumble

(The delivery truck was moving so fast, neither Woody nor Buzz could make out the traffic signs.)

5. **Active:** Red Light, Green Light

(Do you think the Driver of the delivery truck stopped at the traffic lights?)

Green means go and red means stop. One Cub at one end with the others at the other end. The one Cub faces away from the other Cubs. He/she yells green light and the other Cubs start moving up until the Cub yells red light and turns around. The other Cubs have to immediately stop and stay still. The Cub turning around checks to see if he/she can see if anyone moving. If he/she does, he/she can tell that Cub to go back to the start. The game continues until someone crosses past the one Cub.

Sense Training:

1. **Sight:** Find the missing Traffic Sign

2. **Feel:** What have I here?

(On his travels Buzz met another Buzz just like him – the only difference was the new Buzz had a utility belt.)

In a bag, put items from the garage which the Cubs need to feel and identify. Example: hammer, screwdriver, nails, etc.

(I am sure Andy had a bicycle; do you think it was road-worthy?)

Craft/Activity:

1. **Handcraft:** Poster Perfect

Cubs to make a poster for themselves on how to cross the road, with the slogan "Look right, look left, look right again". Let Cubs cut out pictures from magazines to illustrate their posters.

2. **Activity:** Robots?

Cubs are given Marie biscuits which they can ice with the robot colours; some red, some orange and some red. Just before these are eaten, the Leader can ask some relevant questions, to which the Cubs can answer using their "robots" – holding them up. Questions could include: what colour means go?; what colour means STOP?, etc.

Singing/Play Acting:

1. **Singing:** Traffic Light

Twinkle, twinkle traffic light
Round the corner shining bright
Red means stop
Green means go
Yellow means very, very slow

2. **Playacting:** Into the Traffic?

In Sixes, with a Leader per Six, the Cubs get a turn to “drive” along the main road. Mark out an intersection and have some road signs drawn on cardboard. Nominate a driver and a policeman. Policeman holds up the different road signs as the driver gets to the intersection. Everyone else in the Six must check that the driver is doing it properly. You could include some pedestrians who have to cross the road. Everyone to get a turn.

Advancement covered:

Silver Wolf:

Road Safety: Show that you know the basic rules of the road as a pedestrian.

Gold Wolf:

Road Safety: Identify at least ten traffic signs correctly.
