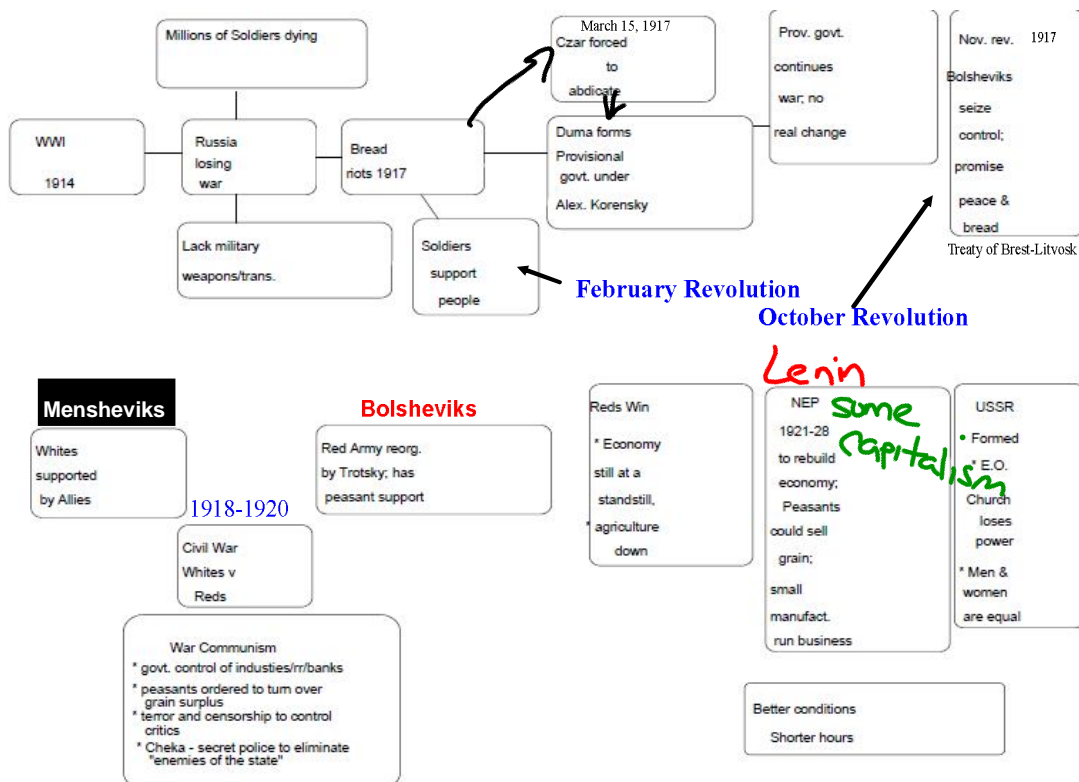




Entrance task: How might the world have been different had the Bolsheviks NOT WON the revolution in 1917?

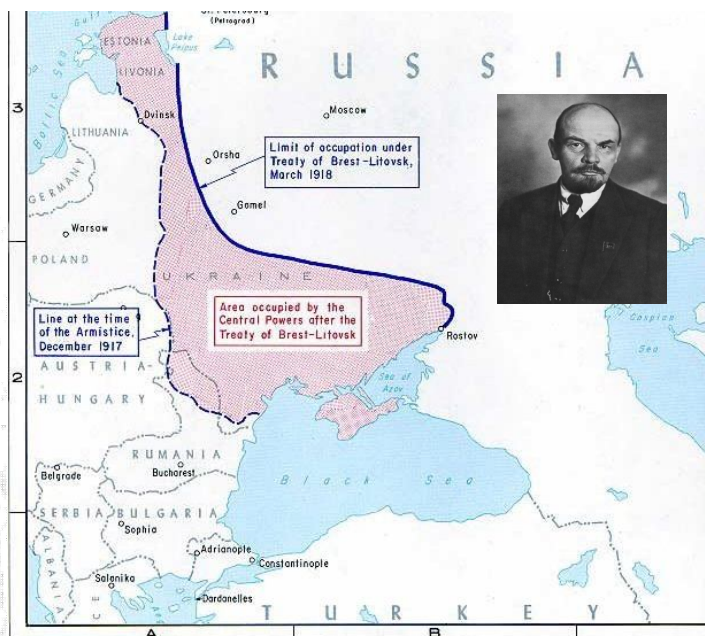


1. The ineffectiveness of czarist rule in Russia was a contributing factor to the Russia Revolution.
2. Bloody Sunday (1905) was an event that led to some reform in Russia.
3. Russia's military failures contributed greatly to the Russian Revolution.

4. The Provisional Government established in March 1917 may have been able to prevent the Bolshevik Revolution had it made a few different decisions.

5. In the civil war in Russia (1918-1920), the Bolsheviks had a clear advantage over the Whites.

6. Lenin's New Economic Policy (NEP) was somewhat surprising given that Russia was now a communist country.

7. Lenin initiated many reforms with the new communist Russian (Soviet) country.
