Called by Pope Paul III

- Reform the Church
- Reconcile with Protestants

Problems at the Council of Trent

- ★ French kings (Catholic) supported Protestants to weaken the German states
- Counciliar movement
- Local leaders saw Protestantism as a way to gain independence from the Holy Roman Empire

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Accomplishments of the Council of Trent

- Scripture and tradition were affirmed as the sources of religious authority and truth
- Reaffirmed the seven sacraments and transubstantiation
- Suppressed pluralism, absenteeism, simony
- Banned indulgences
- Established seminaries in each diocese
- Index of Forbidden Books
- Strengthened the Inquisition
- Established Jesuits ("Soldiers of the Pope")

1. *If anyone saith, that by faith alone the impious is justified...as to mean, that nothing else is required to cooperate in order to the obtaining the grace of Justification...let him be anathema. (Canon on Justification IX)*
2. *If anyone saith, that the grace of Justification is only attained to by those who are predestined unto life; but that all others...are... predestined unto evil; let him be anathema. (Canon on Justification XVII)*
3. *If anyone saith, that nothing besides faith is commanded in the Gospel; that other things are indifferent...or, that the Ten Commandments nowise appertain to Christians; let him be anathema. (Canon on Justification XIX)*
4. *If anyone saith, that, after the grace of Justification has been received, to every penitent sinner...there remains not any debt of temporal punishment...in this world, or...in Purgatory, before the entrance to the kingdom of heaven... let him be anathema. (Canon on Justification XXX)*
5. *(the Synod)...venerates with an equal affection...all the books both of the Old and...New Testament...as also the said traditions...as having been dictated, either by Christ's own word of mouth, or by the Holy Ghost, and preserved in the Catholic Church... (Decree on Scriptures I)*

The purpose of the "Index of Forbidden Books" was to prevent the contamination of the faith or the corruption of morals of Roman Catholics according to canon law, through the reading of theologically erroneous or immoral books.

Canon law, lasting in effect until 1966, prescribed two main types of censorship:

Pre publication censorship of books by Roman Catholics in regard to matters of faith and morals

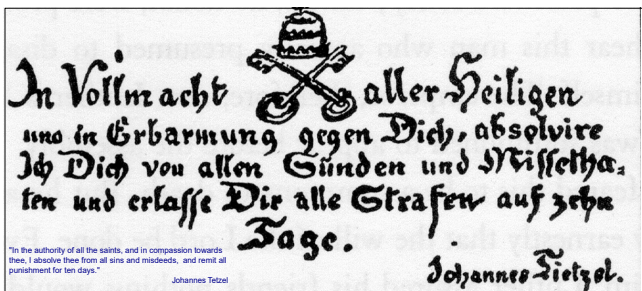





The **cleansing of the Temple** narrative tells of Jesus expelling the merchants and the money changers from the Temple, and occurs in all four canonical gospels of the New Testament.

In this account, Jesus and his disciples travel to Jerusalem for Passover, where Jesus expels the merchants and money changers from the Temple, accusing them of turning the Temple into "a den of thieves" through their commercial activities. In the Gospel of John, Jesus refers to the Temple as "my Father's house" thus, making a claim to being the Son of God.

The narrative occurs near the end of the Synoptic Gospels (at Matthew 21:12-17,

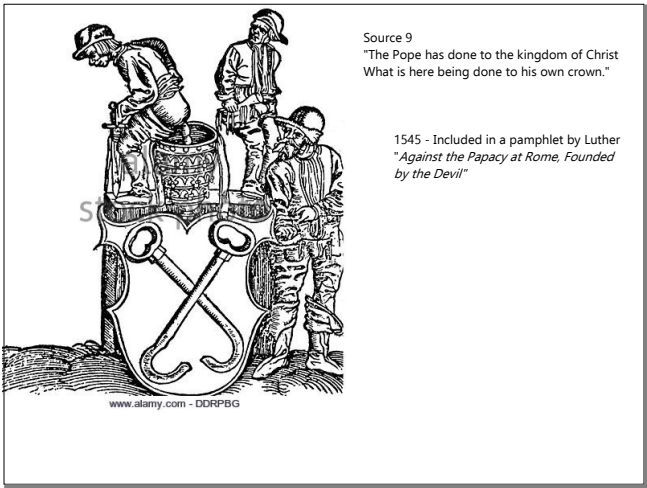
