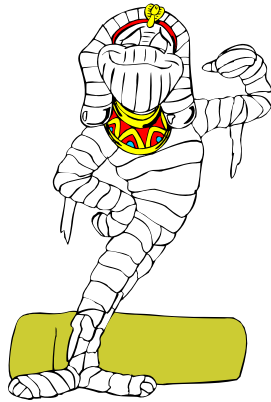


Can You Make a Mummy?

Directions: In a group of 4 or less classmates, you will create a mummy of a person from current day times with artifacts you would find in his/her tomb. You will use this current day mummy to combine it with your knowledge of Egyptian religious beliefs about mummification, tombs, gods/goddesses, and the afterlife as your group works this week. You might want to do further research to gather information or try the online activity at <http://kids.discovery.com/fansites/tutenstein/mummymaker/mummymaker.html> to learn more about the mummification process created by Anubis, the Egyptian god of death.



Requirements:

- Design or bring at least 3 artifacts (items should not have any value in our real life – just pictures or representation of the item – no real gold jewelry please :)
- Write about the mummy and tell how these artifacts represent information from this person's life that he/she will need in the afterlife
- Each group member (not including the mummy) needs to speak at the funeral to share information about the deceased and his/her artifacts
- Create a mummy of one of your group members for your class to honor (please do not remove any of your classmates organs – this is just for show) You can use toilet paper provided in class or bring in your own sheets or other material.
