3	<p>A <b>good</b> interview has 4 well-written questions that</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>❖ are easy to understand</li><li>❖ are specific to the selected religious role from the Medieval Times</li><li>❖ lead to informative responses</li><li>❖ are presented in logical sequence</li></ul> <p>The interview provides reasonable responses to the questions from this person's point of view.</p>
2	<p>A <b>fair</b> interview has 2 or 3 well-written questions that</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>❖ are easy to understand</li><li>❖ are specific to the selected religious role from the Medieval Times</li><li>❖ lead to informative responses</li><li>❖ are presented in logical sequence</li></ul> <p>The interview provides reasonable responses to the questions from this person's point of view, although they might include some inaccurate information.</p>
1	<p>A <b>poor</b> interview does not have clear, focused questions and does not lead to informative responses.</p>
