

Will You Points

1. Listen to Spanish-language radio for one hour (music) or 30 minutes (talk).
2. Watch television in Spanish for 30 minutes.
3. Change your Facebook language to Spanish and play on Facebook for an hour.
4. Read a Spanish-language newspaper for 30 minutes (may be online).
5. Play on one or more corporate Spanish-language websites for 45 minutes.
6. Read a book in Spanish for 30 minutes.
7. Change your cell phone or mp3 player's language to Spanish for an entire week.
8. Read the directions in Spanish of four items in your house or dorm (e.g. detergent).
9. Read the last 50 tweets using a Twitter hash tag for a Latin-American country or city.
10. Read the last 30 Spanish-language tweets by one or more Spanish-speaking artists or politicians on Twitter.
11. Read an article about a famous Latino musician or politician in Spanish on Wikipedia.
12. Watch 3 video clips on sports **and** 3 video clips on current news on Univision.com.
13. Compile a list of 30 words involving the profession you hope to have, on 3x5 cards for your review.
14. Explore the Spanish-language section of a bookstore (music, kids' books, and/or adult books – may be online) for 30 minutes and find two things you would like to own.
15. Converse or chat with someone in Spanish for 30 minutes.
16. Attend an Alianza Latina club meeting.
17. Eat dinner and speak Spanish at Mesa Española for 30 minutes.
18. Listen to at least 5 clips at least A2 or higher on [Audio Lingua](http://www.audiolingua.com/).

19. Watch at least 5 clips Beginning or higher from [UT proficiency site](#).
20. Play around on the [iTunes Latino](#) store and find 2 albums or 5 songs you would like to own.
21. Find a song in Spanish, play it in class, give a brief bio of the singer.
22. Turn on the Spanish soundtrack of your favorite movie and learn 10 new words.
23. Bring in an interesting photo and be prepared to talk about it for 30 seconds.
24. Listen to a podcast (Beginning or Intermediate) at <http://www.notesinspanish.com/> or view a video podcast on the Notes in Spanish YouTube channel at <http://www.youtube.com/user/spanishben/videos>.
25. Read a novel, story, or collection of poems in Spanish for 15 minutes. To find these, you can borrow a book from Srta. Ruddick, check out a book from the OWHL or your local library, or download free samples of Spanish-language books to your e-reader (Kindle, iPad, Nook etc). Authors to try: Isabel Allende, Carlos Ruiz Zafón, Ana María Matute, Julio Cortázar, Elena Poniatowska...
26. Plan an outing in Spain using Guía del Ocio (<http://www.guiadelocio.com/>). Read articles and reviews about movies, theater, dance, concerts, restaurants, events, shopping and other fun things to do around Spain.
27. Talk with a **native speaker** in Spanish for 10 minutes. Record the conversation or have him/her sign your reflection.
28. Find, learn, and recite a poem in Spanish. Find poems [here](#). Try Pablo Neruda, Federico García Lorca, Mario Benedetti, Sor Juana Inés de la Cruz, Jorge Guillén, Gabriela Mistral, Antonio Machado, or Alfonsina Storni.
29. Chat with a friend on Facebook in Spanish for 10 minutes and print out (or take screenshots of) the conversation.
30. Write a brief (2 paragraphs) journal entry, short story or reflection on the topic of your choice in Spanish. Remember translation guidelines! (Translate no more than 2 words per sentence; translate whole phrases of no more than 3 words; keep in mind the kind of word you're translating--verb, noun, adjective etc.)
31. Have a conversation with a friend in Spanish and record it.
32. Watch a soccer game in Spanish.
33. Complete any worksheet activity found on [Zambombazo](#).

34. Call the Denver Story Line (720.865.8500) and choose option #5 to listen to a story in Spanish. Write 1-2 sentences describing the "gist" of the story.
35. Read three comic strips in Spanish -- find them [here](#).
36. Listen to a [Spanish-language music station on Pandora](#) or a [Spanish-language playlist on Songza](#) for 15 minutes.
37. Watch a YouTube tutorial in Spanish for 10 minutes. You can find tutorials in Spanish by searching for "tutoría" and then the topic in Spanish, such as "fútbol", "maquillaje," or "guitarra."
38. Leave me a 1-2 minute message on my Google Voicemail (978-494-4592) in Spanish. Possible topics: What is your favorite memory from childhood? What do you want to be when you grow up? What are your plans for the summer? What was your proudest moment?
39. Stick 10 Post-It notes on items in your dorm or house that you don't know the word for and leave it there for a week, then report to me from memory what all the items were.
40. Complete a song on [lyricstraining.com](#). If you know the song, you have to do intermediate. If you don't know the song, you can do easy.

In order to receive credit (10 activities worth 10 points each), you must indicate the number you chose on a sheet of paper and answer the following questions:

Reflection questions -

1. What did you do? What specific resource did you use?
2. What new words or phrases did you learn? Identify a minimum of three.
3. What did you enjoy or dislike about the experience and why? If you struggled, how did you deal with it?

Be sure to include as much specific information and evidence as possible so that I know you did the activity! Specific information includes article titles, websites, program names, links to resources, names of people, screenshots, pictures, time stamp, etc.
