CHAPTER 1

It All Starts With Support Beginner's Steps

He did a lot work that dealt with satisfying the people which gained a lot of support from them (remember support is key to success). Despite this though, he had some problems with doing much of his work to pertain to his self interests, which lost support, albeit slowly. He may have been great at his job but he sucked at being selfless.

One thing Napoleon was great at was he was good at military work (now if you have no intentions of intervening with the government and controlling an actual country, perhaps this would not apply) and that gains a lot, especially if your country is at peril.

Symbolism is another key to success too. Just like support, symbolism represents who you are and what you stand for. Weak symbolism won't pull off a lot of work, you won't motivate people that way (support, motivate, symbolize) and perhaps just building

your symbolism and support would be the way to start yourself. Napoleon was good at his symbolism. He did his homework when it came to representing to people to what they wanted (unfortunately for the French it was more of what Napoleon wanted, but you know what, he was really good at the whole symbolist thing).

So goody, Napoleon was great at all this stuff, but where exactly did he fall? Well, he wasn't very good at keeping up all this symbolism stuff (keep note though, keeping your reputation may help, but also evolving with the people may also keep up your ability to be a leader) and at some point, people really started realizing he wasn't as great as his made himself. Also, after conquering all those countries in Europe, he couldn't trust anybody to take control of them unless it was his family or a relative. Overestimating can be a problem at times, especially when you can't take them back. Napoleon tried to take over countries that were really too ambitious and perhaps his empire would've lasted much longer if it hadn't been for all his overestimating.

So remember SMS (no, not short message service, however that's a nice way to memorize it) support, motivate and symbolize. Plus sustain would be another good key point to remember.

Sustaining can happen of course, just that you shouldn't let yourself get consumed by too many of your own personal beliefs, especially

SELFISHNESS

But then again, being completely selfless wouldn't exactly be the greatest thing to do, but it would be better than being selfish.

Advice that would go along with sustaining would be to never really overdo any ruling, especially messing with people's heads too much. It may be useful, fun and entertaining but if there's a problem, that is one big mess to clean up. Just try to stay a little conservative on that, it will help.

Sustaining also consists of being able to give your power to other people. If you distribute your power, sparingly, then it could give you a nice boost on the amount of

area you're covering to give the boost. Trust may be an issue, but when you gain it, it can be a very nice thing to deal with. Treason might as well could get you killed so try to stay away from doing anything backstabbing (no drama please).
